Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill would prohibit a state agency from sharing personally identifiable information with any federal official or federal agency unless the data is masked or anonymized. The data could be shared to comply with other state or federal laws, or to carry out the administration of a state or federal program. Any person who negligently violates this prohibition shall be liable to any injured person as a result, for actual damages to that person, exemplary damages of not more than \$1,000, and costs and reasonable actual attorney fees.

The Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection does not anticipate any fiscal impact as a result of this bill. The department currently shares information in limited circumstances to administer state or federal programs.
