Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Senate Bill 369 would require state agencies, including the Legislature, to not share personally identifiable information with the federal government. The bill also provides exceptions to the requirements of not sharing data with the federal government, including, to the extent necessary: (a) to comply with other state and federal laws or to carry out the administration of state or federal programs; (b) to carry out constituent relations or other official duties for members of the Legislature; and (c) to carry out the official duties of the courts. The Legislature, including both chambers as well as the six legislative service agencies, does not anticipate any operational impacts would result from the provisions of the bill. The bill also does not contain any appropriations. Therefore, the bill would have no fiscal effect for the Legislature.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications
