The Chief Clerk received the following coauthor and cosponsor requests on June 4, 2025:

Representative Moses added as a coauthor of **Assembly Bill 257**, relating to: advanced practice registered nurses, extending the time limit for emergency rule procedures, providing an exemption from emergency rule procedures, and granting rule-making authority.

Representative Udell added as a coauthor of **Assembly Joint Resolution 59**, Relating to: proclaiming June as Dairy Month in Wisconsin.

Representative Udell added as a coauthor of **Assembly Bill 173**, relating to: regulation of pharmacy benefit managers, fiduciary and disclosure requirements on pharmacy benefit managers, and application of prescription drug payments to health insurance cost-sharing requirements.

Representative Moses added as a coauthor of **Assembly Joint Resolution 57**, Relating to: urging support for a constitutional amendment to provide states with authority to regulate campaign financing.
