2025 Assembly Bill 259

Assembly Amendment 1

2025 ASSEMBLY BILL 259

2025 Assembly Bill 259 specifies that ch. 704, Stats., Wisconsin's landlord-tenant law, does not apply to an occupant, guest, or guest of an occupant or guest of a campground or camping resort that is licensed by the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) under s. 97.67, Stats.

The bill also created a new crime of criminal trespass to a campground. Specifically, that crime prohibits entering a campground or remaining on campground premises without the consent of the operator of the campground. A campground operator may provide a written request to a person who has entered or remained on the premises of the campground without the campground operator's consent to immediately depart. A person who fails to immediately depart after receiving such a request may be fined up to \$100 or imprisoned for up to 30 days, or both. Additionally, a law enforcement officer who has probable cause to believe that a person has violated this prohibition must arrest and take the person into custody.

ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1

Assembly Amendment 1 removes the crime of criminal trespass to a campground, and instead specifies that the existing offense of trespass to land applies to a person who enters or remains on the premises of a campground¹ after having been notified not to enter or remain on the premises or after having been notified that the owner or operator has withdrawn consent for the person to enter or remain on the premises. Under existing law, a person who trespasses to land is subject to a Class B forfeiture.

The amendment also allows a law enforcement officer, at the request of the campground owner or operator, to assist in removing from the premises a person who trespasses to a campground.

The amendment retains the provision in the bill that specifies that ch. 704, Stats., does not apply to an occupant, guest, or guest of an occupant or guest of a campground or camping resort that is licensed by DATCP.

BILL HISTORY

Representative Dallman offered Assembly Amendment 1 on June 9, 2025. On June 11, 2025, the Assembly Committee on Criminal Justice and Public Safety voted to recommend adoption of the amendment and passage of the bill, as amended, on votes of Ayes, 15; Noes, 0.

¹ For purposes of this prohibition, "campground" means a campground or camping resort licensed by DATCP under s. 97.67, Stats., but does not include a campground established by the Department of Natural Resources under s. 27.01 (10), Stats.
