EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 19

WHEREAS, unusually heavy rains, commencing on August 23, 1975, were experienced in the Counties of Buffalo, Jackson, Pepin, Pierce, and Trempealeau of Wisconsin, causing extensive flooding and serious erosion damage to highway facilities on the Federal Aid Systems; and

WHEREAS, such damage was sufficiently extensive to require immediate repairs; and

WHEREAS, such conditions constitute an emergency as contemplated in Sections 120(f), 125, and 315 of Title 23, U.S. Code:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, PATRICK J. LUCEY, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim that a

STATE OF EMERGENCY

exists in the above-enumerated counties of this state, and hereby request that the Secretary of Transportation of the United States concur in the declaration of this emergency.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison, this eighth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-five.
