EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 36

WHEREAS, a vacancy exists in the office of the State Senator from the 33rd Senate District, as a result of the resignation of Roger P. Murphy, whose term of office would have expired on the first Monday in January, 1981;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LEE SHERMAN DREYFUS, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 8.50, Wisconsin Statutes, do hereby order that a Special Election, to fill the existing vacancy, be held on April 29, 1980, in the 33rd Senate District, consisting of part of Waukesha County, as described in Section 4.33, Wisconsin Statutes.


AND, the circulation of nominating papers for partisan and independent candidates may commence on March 1, 1980; the deadline for filing nomination papers for partisan and independent candidates shall be 5:00 P.M., March 11, 1980. The special primary shall be held on April 1, 1980. The election shall be noticed, held, conducted, canvassed, and returned in accordance with the law. Voting machine recorders may be reactivated 14 days after the special primary unless there is litigation pending, a demand for a recount or notice of an election contest in which case paper ballots may be used for the special election.
