EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 53

WHEREAS, a vacancy exists in the office of the State Senator from the 13th Senate District, as a result of the resignation of Peter D. Bear, whose term of office would have expired on the first Monday in January, 1983;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Russell A. Olson, Acting Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 8.50, Wisconsin Statutes, do hereby order that a Special Election, to fill the existing vacancy be held on December 2, 1980, in the 13th Senate District, consisting of parts of Dane, Jefferson and Walworth Counties as described in Section 4.13, Wisconsin Statutes.

AND, the circulation of nominating papers for partisan and independent candidates may commence on September 16, 1980; the deadline for filing nomination papers for partisan and independent candidates shall be 5:00 p.m. October 7, 1980. The special primary shall be held on November 4, 1980. The election shall be noticed, held, conducted, canvassed and returned in accordance with the law. Voting machine recorders may be reactivated 14 days after the special primary unless there is litigation pending, a demand for a recount or notice of an election contest in which case paper ballots may be used for the special election.
