

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 100

WHEREAS, the greatest number of deaths and injuries on our highways have historically occurred between Memorial Day and Labor Day; and

WHEREAS, more motorists are expected to use Wisconsin highways during the last holiday weekend than ever before in the State's history; and

WHEREAS, an unconscionable number of citizens will be killed or injured on Wisconsin highways during the summer unless all available resources are utilized to support highway safety efforts;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LEE SHERMAN DREYFUS, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby declare a

STATE OF EMERGENCY.

to exist in Wisconsin starting at 12:00 noon, Friday, September 3, 1982, and continuing to 12:00 midnight, September 6, 1982, and urge all motorists traveling on Wisconsin highways to exercise extreme caution, to respect the 55 MPH speed limit, to not drive while under the influence of drugs or alcohol, and to assist in reducing highway accidents.

FURTHER, under the authority contained in Section 21.11 of the Wisconsin Statutes, I hereby order into state service sufficient personnel, with their consent, and that equipment of the Wisconsin National Guard as necessary to conduct the "Friend in the Sky" by assisting the members of the Wisconsin State Patrol and Local law enforcement agencies in the medical evacuation of injured individuals during the critical period.

AND FURTHER, I do hereby declare that this Executive Order No. 100 supercedes Executive Order No. 99, issued 26, 1982.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this 2nd day of Sept. in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred eighty-two.
