
EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 102

WHEREAS, a vacancy will exist in the office of State Senator from the 8th Senate District on January 3, 1983 as a result of the resignation of James T. Flynn who, pursuant to Section 8.50(4)(e), Wisconsin Statutes, has submitted a written resignation in anticipation of assuming the office of Lieutenant Governor on January 3, 1983 and whose term of office would have expired on the first Monday in January, 1985;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LEE SHERMAN DREYFUS, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 8.50, Wisconsin Statutes, do hereby order that a Special Election, to fill the anticipated vacancy, be held on April 5, 1983, in the 8th Senate District, consisting of parts of Milwaukee County, as described in the order issued by the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Wisconsin on June 17, 1982 in the case of The Wisconsin State AFL-CIO, et al. v. Elections Board, et al., Civil Action 82-C-0113;

AND, the circulation of nominating papers for partisan and independent candidates may commence on December 10, 1982; the deadline for filing nomination papers for partisan and independent candidates shall be 5:00 p.m., January 11, 1983. The special primary shall be held on February 15, 1983. The election shall be noticed, held, conducted, canvassed and returned in accordance with the law.
