

EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 38


WHEREAS, a vacancy exists in the office of Representative to the United States Congress from Fourth Congressional District, due to the death of Representative Clement Zablocki, whose term would have expired in January, 1985

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Anthony S. Earl, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority given me by Wis. Stats. §§ 8.50 and 17.18, do order that a special election to fill the vacancy be held on April 3, 1984, coinciding with the spring general election, in the Fourth Congressional District as described in 1981-82 Wis. Stats. § 3.04, which district includes portions of the counties of Milwaukee and Waukesha.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the circulation of nomination papers for candidates may commence on the date of this order and said nomination papers may be filed no later than 5:00 p.m., January 3, 1984, and the primary, if one is necessary, shall be held on February 21, 1984 coinciding with the spring primary. The election shall be held, conducted, canvassed and returned in accordance with the law.
