


EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER 42

WHEREAS, a vacancy exists in the office of State Senator from the Thirty-second Senate District, due to the resignation of Paul Offner, whose term would have expired in January, 1985;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Anthony S. Earl, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority given me by Wis. Stats. § 8.50, do order that a special election to fill the vacancy be held on April 3, 1984, coinciding with the spring general election, in the Thirty-second Senate District as described in 1983 Wisconsin Act 29, which district includes portions of the counties of La Crosse, Monroe, Vernon, Crawford and Grant.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the circulation of nomination papers for candidates may commence on the date of this order and said nomination papers may be filed no later than 5:00 p.m., January 17, 1984, and the primary, if one is necessary, shall be held on February 21, 1984 coinciding with the spring primary. The election shall be held, conducted, canvassed and returned in accordance with the law.
