EXECUTIVE ORDER #88

Relating to a Special Election for the
Fourteenth Assembly District

WHEREAS, State Representative Thomas Barrett was elected to the State Senate on December 12, 1989, and

WHEREAS, State Representative Thomas Barrett resigned as a Representative to the State Assembly on December 21, 1989;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Wisconsin Statute section 8.50 order that a special election be held on May 1, 1990 to fill the vacancy in the fourteenth Assembly district as described in Wis. Stats. s.4.14 for a term expiring the day preceding the first Monday in January, 1991, and that if a primary is necessary, it be held on April 3, 1990. Circulation of nomination papers for candidates may begin on the date of this order and nomination papers may be filed no later than 5:00 p.m., March 6, 1990. This election shall be held, conducted, canvassed and returned in accordance with law.
