EXECUTIVE ORDER #96

Relating to creation of the Governor's Council
on Urban Indian Affairs

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin has an obligation to promote equality of opportunity for all its people; and

WHEREAS, state government could benefit from the advice of people who are knowledgeable and experienced with regard to the impact of State policies on minority groups and methods by which its service to these citizens could be improved; and

WHEREAS, there presently exists Governor's Councils on Asian Affairs, Black Affairs, Hispanic Affairs and a Governor's Committee on Minority Affairs;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of this State, and specifically by Wisconsin Statute section 14.019, do hereby establish

THE GOVERNOR'S COUNCIL ON URBAN INDIAN AFFAIRS

1. The Council shall consist of not more than thirteen (13) members appointed by the Governor, to serve at his pleasure. The Chair shall be appointed by the Governor.
2. Three members of this council, chosen by said council, shall serve on the Governor's Committee on Minority Affairs.
3. The Council shall develop positions relative to the issues concerning their community, make recommendations to the Governor, through the Governor's Committee on Minority Affairs and develop strategies to implement position(s) taken on the identified issues.
4. Whenever appropriate, the Councils and the Committee shall coordinate their activities with those of other state agencies and departments in order to prevent any duplication of effort in areas of mutual concern.

5. Staff assistance for the Council shall be arranged through the Governor's Office in Milwaukee.
6. Direct the Secretary of the Department of Administration to provide the Council with sums of money that are necessary and proper for the legitimate travel expenses of Council members under Section 20.505(3)(a) of the Wisconsin Statutes.
