EXECUTIVE ORDER #123

Relating to Proclamation of a State of Emergency

WHEREAS, severe weather occurred on July 7, 1991 in south central and southeastern Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, the severe weather, which included high winds, hail and heavy rains resulted in significant damage to the public and private sectors, including the agricultural sector; and

WHEREAS, the severe weather and resulting damage have endangered the safety and well-being of the citizens of the affected areas; and

WHEREAS, Dane, Jefferson, Milwaukee, Ozaukee, Washington and Waukesha counties have been most seriously affected by the severe weather and have incurred the most significant damage;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of this State, and specifically by Wisconsin Statute section 166.03(1)(b)(1), do hereby:

Declare a State of Emergency, effective July 8, 1991, in the counties of Dane, Jefferson, Milwaukee, Ozaukee, Washington and Waukesha and direct the Division of Emergency Government and other appropriate state and local government agencies to take whatever actions are necessary to ensure the safety and well-being of the affected citizens and to coordinate recovery activities with the above-referenced counties.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Wisconsin to be affixed. Done at the Capitol in the City of Madison this twelfth day of July in the year one thousand nine hundred and ninety-one.
