EXECUTIVE ORDER #151

Proclamation of a State of Emergency

WHEREAS, a train derailment occurred on June 30, 1992 in Superior, Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, the contaminants released from the railroad cars are toxic and dangerous to public health; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of this State, and specifically by Wisconsin Statute section 166.03(1)(b)(1), do hereby:


Declare a State of Emergency, effective June 30, 1992, in Douglas County and direct the Wisconsin National Guard and the Division of Emergency Government to assist state and local government agencies in taking whatever actions are necessary to ensure the safety and well-being of the affected citizens and to coordinate recovery activities with the above-referenced county.
