EXECUTIVE ORDER #158

Relating to Proclamation of a State of Emergency

WHEREAS, severe weather occurred on August 29, 1992 in North Central Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, the severe weather, which included tornados, high winds, hail and heavy rains resulted in significant damage to the public and private sectors, including the agricultural sector; and

WHEREAS, Waushara County has been most seriously affected by the severe weather and has incurred the most significant damage;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of this State, and specifically by Wisconsin Statute section 166.03(1)(b)(1), do hereby:


Declare a State of Emergency, effective August 29, 1992, in Waushara County and direct the Division of Emergency Government and other appropriate state and local government agencies to take whatever actions are necessary to ensure the safety and well-being of the affected citizens and to coordinate recovery activities with the above-referenced county.
