
EXECUTIVE ORDER #181


Relating to a Special Election for the
Seventy-Ninth State Assembly District

WHEREAS, State Representative Joseph S. Wineke submitted his resignation as a State Representative for the Seventy-Ninth Assembly District, effective upon being sworn into the State Senate;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, pursuant to Wisconsin Statute section 8.50 order that a special election be held on June 29, 1993 to fill the vacancy in the Seventy-Ninth Assembly District as described in Wis. Stats. s.4.79 for a term expiring the first Monday in January 1995; and that if a primary is necessary, it be held on June 7, 1993. Circulation of nomination papers for candidates may begin on the date of this order and nomination papers may be filed no later than 5:00 p.m., May 4, 1993. This election shall be held, conducted, canvassed and returned in accordance with law.
