EXECUTIVE ORDER #182

Relating to the Clearing of Voting Machine Recorders for the  
City of Kenosha and the Village of Pleasant Prairie  
for the Congressional Special Election on May 4, 1993

WHEREAS, the Governor may by order permit the clearing of  
voting machine recorders on machines needed to conduct special  
elections; and

WHEREAS, a special election for the first congressional seat  
is to be held on May 4, 1993; and


WHEREAS, the deadline for requesting a recount for the local  
and county races has expired and no petition has been filed;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State  
of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution  
and the laws of this State, and specifically by Wisconsin Statute  
section 7.23(2), do hereby:


Authorize the City of Kenosha and the Village of Pleasant  
Prairie in Kenosha County to clear the voting machine recorders on  
voting machines located in their municipalities that were used at  
the April 6, 1993, Spring Election. The municipalities may begin  
clearing the recorders on April 19, 1993, in order to prepare for  
the conduct of the May 4, 1993, congressional special election.
