EXECUTIVE ORDER #257

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flags of the United States and the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for The Honorable Donald J. Hanaway, Late Judge of the Circuit Court of Brown County

WHEREAS, on the evening of September 7, 1995 Judge Donald J. Hanaway passed away; and

WHEREAS, Judge Hanaway served on the Circuit Court of Brown County from July 1, 1991 until his death; and

WHEREAS, Judge Hanaway served as Attorney General of the State of Wisconsin from 1987 to 1991; and

WHEREAS, Judge Hanaway served in the Wisconsin State Senate representing the Second District from 1979 to 1986; and

WHEREAS, Judge Hanaway devoted many years of his life to public service;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all State buildings and grounds equipped with such flags beginning sunrise September 12, 1995 until sundown September 12, 1995. In addition, I authorize the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin to be flown at half-staff at all public buildings and grounds in Brown County beginning September 8, 1995 until sundown September 12, 1995.
