EXECUTIVE ORDER # 82

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Lance Corporal Richard Warner of the United States Marine Corps Reserve Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom


WHEREAS, on December 13, 2004, Lance Corporal Richard Warner, a member of Fox Company, 2nd Battalion, 24th Marine Regiment, 4th Marine Division, United States Marine Corps Reserve, died as a result of wounds received during enemy action in Iraq; and

WHEREAS, Lance Corporal Richard Warner provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and


WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Lance Corporal Richard Warner; and

WHEREAS, Lance Corporal Richard Warner will be laid to rest on Thursday, December 23, 2004;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on **Thursday, December 23, 2004**, and ending at sunset on that date.
