EXECUTIVE ORDER # 188

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Sergeant Chad Allen of the United States Marine Corps Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom


WHEREAS, on February 28, 2007, Sergeant Chad Allen, a member of 2nd Light Armored Reconnaissance Battalion, 2nd Marine Division, II Marine Expeditionary Force, United States Marine Corps, died as a result of injuries sustained during enemy action in Iraq; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Chad Allen provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the United States; and


WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Sergeant Chad Allen; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant Chad Allen will be laid to rest on Saturday, March 10, 2007;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on March 10, 2007, and ending at sunset on that date.
