EXECUTIVE ORDER # 204

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Sergeant First Class Scott Brown of the United States Army Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom

WHEREAS, on May 18, 2007, Sergeant First Class Scott Brown, a member of 1st Battalion, 325th Airborne Infantry Regiment, 2nd Brigade Combat Team, 82nd Airborne Division, United States Army, died as a result of injuries sustained during enemy action in Iraq; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant First Class Scott Brown provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Sergeant First Class Scott Brown; and

WHEREAS, Sergeant First Class Scott Brown will be laid to rest on Tuesday, May 29, 2007;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on May 29, 2007, and ending at sunset on that date.
