Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Chief Petty Officer Patrick Wade of the United States Navy Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom


WHEREAS, on July 17, 2007, Chief Petty Officer Patrick Wade, a member of the Explosive Ordinance Disposal Mobile Unit Eleven, United States Navy, died as a result of injuries sustained during enemy action in Iraq; and

WHEREAS, Chief Petty Officer Patrick Wade provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and


WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Chief Petty Officer Patrick Wade; and

WHEREAS, a memorial service will be held for Chief Petty Officer Patrick Wade on Monday, November 12, 2007;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on November 12, 2007, and ending at sunset on that date.
