11. Fiscal Analysis Summary

Effective July 1, 2006, 2005 Act 74 transferred the department's authority to operate Health Insurance Risk-Sharing Plan (HIRSP) to the Health Insurance Risk-Sharing Plan Authority that was created under Act 74. Consequently, the department is no longer legally authorized to operate HIRSP or to promulgate or implement ch. HFS 119 rules relating to the operation of HIRSP. Repeal of ch. HFS 119 is, therefore, necessary.

The order to repeal ch. HFS 119, will not result in a fiscal impact that is independent of that identified in the fiscal estimate made by the department for 2005 Assembly Bill 844, creating 2005 Act 74.
