## 11. Fiscal Analysis Summary

This corrected fiscal estimate reflects the corrections in terminology, specifically to replace the phrase "home care" used in the original fiscal estimate with the phrase "personal care" in item 3., and to include the phrase "and bands" after "tribes in the original summary as suggested by the Legislative Council Rules Clearinghouse. The rule will provide the authority for the Department to certify federally recognized American Indian tribes and bands in Wisconsin as providers of personal care services under Wisconsin Medicaid. The proposed amendment will allow a new category of agency to be certified as a provider of personal care services under the Wisconsin Medicaid program, thus increasing the number of providers available in Wisconsin to provide personal care services due to the increased availability of providers.

## 12. Long-Range Fiscal Implications

It may take a number of years for the full impact of this expansion to develop since tribes may not immediately establish personal care service programs and it may take time for the programs to be implemented and developed. Due to limited Medicaid reimbursement rates, tribes may need to subsidize these programs to cover costs that exceed the Medicaid reimbursement rate, and as a result, it may take time to build a program due to the need for local resources.

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
