CLEARINGHOUSE RULE 17-006

Ch. DHS 78, Telecommunication Assistance for Deaf, Deafblind and Severely Hard of Hearing Persons

Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

The Telecommunication Assistance Program (TAP) provides assistance to income eligible deaf, severely hard of hearing and deafblind persons in securing telecommunication devices capable of serving their needs. Chapter DHS 78 establishes application processing procedures, and eligibility requirements for the program.

The procedures currently described in ch. DHS 78 are outdated and do not reflect the program's current needs and objectives. The department proposes to update the rule to clarify eligibility requirements; to revise application and processing requirements; to reflect current program operations; and to reflect the changes in technology available to assist the deaf, deafblind and severely hard of hearing persons that have occurred since the rule was last revised in 2003.
