IV. DETAILED STATEMENT EXPLAINING THE BASIS AND PURPOSE OF THE PROPOSED RULE, INCLUDING HOW THE PROPOSED RULE ADVANCES RELEVANT STATUTORY GOALS OR PURPOSES:

The rule project clarifies that there are two separate examinations required for licensure as a social worker, one which tests whether or not the applicant is competent in their area of practice, and another which tests the applicant's knowledge of Wisconsin statutes and rules related to their practice area. Currently, the rules refer to the examinations as two parts of the same examination, when they are actually two separate examinations.

The rules currently exempt an applicant from taking the Wisconsin statutes and rules examination if they have passed the examination as part of an application for another social worker credential within the last five years. The rule project removes the five-year requirement.

The rule project also repeals obsolete provisions relating to examination review and claims of examination error, as well as a provision allowing the Board to deny the release of grades or issuance of a credential if the board determines that the applicant violated rules of conduct or otherwise acted dishonestly.

The Marriage and Family Therapy, Professional Counseling, and Social Work Examining Board held a public hearing on December 10, 2019. No public comments were received.
