The Public Service Commission of Wisconsin proposes an order to renumber and amend PSC 118.02(5g)(e) and create PSC 118.02(5g)(f) regarding allowing an electric provider, or customer or member of an electric provider, to create a renewable resource credit for heat that is a byproduct of a manufacturing process and is used to provide thermal energy for another purpose.

INITIAL REGULATORY FLEXIBILITY ANALYSIS

This rule will not affect small businesses. The Wis. Stat. § 227.114 (1) definition of "small business" states that to be considered a small business, the business must not be dominant in its field. Since gas, electric, and water utilities are monopolies in their service territories, they are dominant in their fields, and so, are not small businesses.
