RULEMAKING REPORT TO LEGISLATURE

CLEARINGHOUSE RULE 24-082

Ch. DHS 163, 181 and 182

Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

In 2021, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention ("CDC") lowered the blood lead level at which it recommends intervention in cases of lead poisoning. The CDC now recommends public health interventions at 3.5 µg/dL, rather than 5 µg/dL, the current value provided in s. 254.11 (9), Stats. The Department is therefore obligated, by s. 254.156, Stats., to promulgate a rule defining "lead poisoning or lead exposure" in s. DHS 181.03 (10) to correspond to the blood lead level specification set by the CDC.

Sections DHS 163.03 (67) and 182.03 (10) also contain definitions of lead poisoning or lead exposure that are inconsistent with the blood lead level specification set by the CDC. Therefore, the Department will modify these definitions to correspond to the CDC blood lead reference value.

Based on the mandate to promulgate rules under s. 254.156, Stats., there are no reasonable alternatives to the proposed rulemaking.
