RULEMAKING REPORT TO LEGISLATURE

CLEARINGHOUSE RULE 25-004

Ch. DHS 105 & 107

Basis and Purpose of Proposed Rule

The Department of Health Services' administrative code outlines certification criteria for prenatal care coordinator ("PNCC) providers in DHS 105.52 and covered PNCC services in s. DHS 107.34. Previously, certified PNCC providers in Milwaukee County and the City of Racine were automatically certified to provide child care coordination ("CCC) services, and rules did not contain specific CCC certification criteria or identify which specific services were covered under the CCC benefit.

Due to concerns about fraud, waste, and abuse among providers of the CCC benefit, the department paused enrollment of CCC providers from November 2023 to December 2024 under a federally approved moratorium.

In order to mitigate the risk of future fraud, waste, and abuse within PNCC or CCC provider enrollment and reimbursement, the department proposes rules for both benefits to achieve the following:

- Update PNCC certification criteria and documentation requirements, and to set records retention requirements.
- Create CCC certification criteria and documentation requirements, and to set records retention requirements.
- Update which services are and are not covered under the PNCC benefit.
- Identify which services are and are not covered under the CCC benefit.

Department Response to Legislative Council Rules Clearinghouse Recommendations

The department accepts the recommendations made by the Legislative Council Rules Clearinghouse and has modified the proposed rules where suggested except as follows:

Clearinghouse Comment 2.n.

- *Comment*: In SECTION 25 of the proposed rule, in s. DHS 105.525 (6) (c), consider merging the introduction and subunits under a single reference to "the resources identified in s. DHS 105.52 (4) (c)", in its entirety. This would capture the proposed rule's new provisions in s. DHS 105.52 (4) (c) 10g. and 10r., and existing subd. 11., rather than duplicating that language.
- *Department response:* The Department modified s. DHS 105.525 (6) (c) to include references to s. DHS 105.52 (4) (c) 10g. and 10r., but not subd. 11. Section DHS 105.52 (4) (c) 11. refers to MA-certified primary care and obstetric providers. Child care coordination extends postpartum, so referrals should be made to pediatric providers and not obstetric providers.

Clearinghouse Comment 4.c.

- *Comment*: In SECTION 25 of the proposed rule, in s. DHS 105.525 (2) (c), is there a reason why the duties that must be performed by a qualified professional reference only s. DHS 105.52 (2) (c) 1. to 4., instead of subds. 1. to 5.? If a reference to only subds. 1. to 4. is intended, this comment may be disregarded.
- *Department response:* The reference only intended to include s. DHS 105.52 (2) (c) 1. to 4. Subdivision 5. is specific to Prenatal Care Coordination under s. DHS 105.52 and does not apply to Child Care Coordination under s. DHS 105.525.
