## **ORDER OF THE EDUCATIONAL APPROVAL BOARD**

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## **REPEALING, RENUMBERING, AMENDING AND CREATING RULES**

The Wisconsin Educational Approval Board adopts an order to repeal §§ EAB 5.11 (9) (f) through (i), (10) (e), and (10) (g) through (i); to renumber and amend §§ EAB 5.11 (9) (j) and (10) (j); to amend §§ EAB 5.11 (1) (a) through (d), (3) (i), (4) (a) 1 through 3, (4) (b) (intro.), (5) (a), (5) (b) (intro.), (7) (c), (9) (a) through (e), and (10) (a) through (d); to repeal and recreate § EAB 5.11 (2) and (10) (f); and to create §§ 5.11 (4) (a) 4 and 5, (4) (c), (5) (a) 4 and 5, (5) (c), and (7) (d), relating to fees which the board charges to schools requesting approval under § 38.51 (10), Stats.

## Analysis by the Educational Approval Board

Statutory Authority: §§ 38.51 (3) and (10) (c) and 227.11 (2), Stats.

Statutes Interpreted: § 38.51 (10) (c), Stats.

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This order revises the application, amendment and late fees contained in § EAB 5.11, Wis. Adm. Code, which interprets § 38.51 (10) (c), Stats.

Under the provisions of § 38.51 (10) (c), Stats., fees paid by schools must cover all costs for examination and approval (licensing) of such schools. The fee schedule in permanent rule at the time this order was prepared included a number of fixed application and amendment fees which did not differentiate between types of degree programs above the associate degree level, because the agency has dealt with few schools offering programs at the baccalaureate level and above.

However, as the result of narrowed exceptions to the licensing requirement after the passage of 1993 Wisconsin Act 61, the agency is now dealing with numerous educational institutions which offer baccalaureate and higher degrees, and must adjust the application fees to accommodate the additional level of program complexity.

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In addition, the agency has now had three years' experience in charging fees for review of revised programs, for review of amendments to applications, and for late renewal applications and payments. This experience has clarified how review activities relate to actual effort and costs, and the revisions to fee amounts reflect that experience. EAB continues to believe that schools creating a workload bear primary responsibility for providing the resources to cover the workload, and the increased charges for school and program applications and for application amendments reflect the agency's attempt to assess charges to responsible schools rather than relying on the second renewal payment from all schools.

The amendments to § EAB 5.11 increase most school and program application and amendment fees. They also make the following changes to fees assessed for filing and amending applications:

1. The changes to sub. (2) restate the initial application fee as a total fee for the school and one program of a particular type. The present sub. (2) only lists the school application fee, and refers applicants to sub. (4) for the program fee. We have found that schools applying for initial approval often overlook the relationship between sub. (2) and sub. (4) and only pay the school application fee instead of paying the school and program fee both.

- 2. In sub. (4), (5), (9) and (10), one fee level for programs above the associate degree level has been split into separate levels for baccalaureate, master's and doctoral programs.
  - The fee reduction granted by sub. (4) (b) and (5) (b) is reduced from 50% to 25% in sub. (4) (b) and to 10% in sub. (5) (b). Analysis of costs and workload indicates that reliance on program review by another state agency only cut actual costs by a maximum of 25%.

The amending fees for noncomplying school and program applications have been split into three categories (amendments for documents only, revisions to program content, substantial revisions to program content), and have been restated as a percentage of the base application fee rather than as a flat dollar amount.

The table below shows the changes in fees by category. For ease of comparison, the table provides actual dollar amounts for amending fees rather than the percentages actually stated in the changes.

The revised fees will apply to new or amended applications for renewal of approval which expires on or after December 1, 1995, to any late applications or payments for renewal of approval received on or after September 1, 1995, and to any other applications or amended application materials received on or after the effective date of the rule.

The order also creates new provisions permitting a reduction ranging from 10% to 50% in the school or program application fee under certain circumstances. Under the provisions, a school and the program in question must meet **all** of the following conditions in order to qualify for the reduced fee:

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 The school making application for approval of the program is incorporated in a state other than Wisconsin, has its main campus outside Wisconsin, and offers in Wisconsin only programs leading to a baccalaureate or higher degree.

- 2. The school presents written evidence of authorization from its home state to offer the program and degree which it desires to offer to Wisconsin residents.
- 3. The school presents written evidence of authorization from states in which the school is authorized to offer the program and degree.
- 4. The school presents written evidence that it is accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the U. S. Department of Education to offer the program and degree which it desires to offer to Wisconsin residents.
- 5. The school presents written evidence that its home state gives similar Wisconsin schools at least an equivalent fee reduction in comparable licensing and oversight fees.

Provisions 1 through 4 are similar to ones contained in an emergency rule which the agency adopted on December 2, 1994, and which were in effect until May 1, 1995. Provision 5 was added at the direction of the Senate Education and Financial Institutions Committee after legislative review of the rule.
