Quality Natural Resources Management Through Excellent Customer Service ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD REPEALING, AMENDING AND CREATING RULES

The Wisconsin Natural Resources Board adopts an order to repeal NR 21.11(1)(j), 22.11(11) and 26.01(63)(a); to amend NR 20.03(1)(a)1.c., d., f., 6., and 9., (4)(g)27., 20.04 (3)(am)13., 20.07(1)(f), 21.06(2), 22.06(3), 23.05(2), 26.08(14)(a) and 26.21(44)(a); and to create NR 20.04(5) and 26.09(63)(a) relating to sport and commercial fishing and fish refuges

Statutory authority: ss. 29.174, 29.155(1h), and 227.11(2)(a), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: ss. 29.085 and 29.174(2)(a), Stats.

In this order:

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Section 1 changes the opening day of the delayed largemouth and smallmouth bass harvest season in northern zone waters from the Saturday nearest June 20 to the third Saturday in June;

Section 2 deletes Lowe Creek pond from the trout table;

Section 3 clarifies the definition of the portions of the Pecatonica river that are open to year around fishing;

Section 4 provides for the transport by the public of certain nonindigenous fishes to a Department office for verification;

Sections 5, 6, 8 and 10 make the "sorting" rule in boundary waters consistent with inland waters, and would now allow the subsequent release of fish taken into possession and counted toward the daily bag limit in boundary waters (currently, once a fish is taken into possession, it cannot be released);

Sections 7 and 9 repeal a provision that requires rough fish to be disposed of by commercial operators. This brings the code into compliance with recent statutory changes;

Sections 11 and 13 change the fish refuge at the Rest Lake dam on the Manitowish river (Vilas county) from a year around closure to an April 1 to May 31 closure;

Section 12 corrects the description of the fish refuge on Beaver Dam creek, Dodge county;

Section 14 corrects the description of the fish refuge on the Tomahawk river, Oneida county.

SECTION 4. NR 20.04(5) is created to read:

NR 20.04(5) Notwithstanding ss. NR 20.02(1)(fg) and (fh) and 20.03(1)(t) and (u), a person may kill and possess one of each of the following for immediate delivery to a department office: ruffe, white perch and goby.

SECTION 5. NR 20.07(1)(f) is amended to read:

NR 20.07(1)(f) Any fish taken into actual and retained in possessionunless that is not released freely into the water immediately after capture shall be included as considered part of the angler's daily bag limit.

SECTION 6. NR 21.06(2) is amended to read:

NR 21.06(2) Sorting. Any fish taken and retained in possession that is not released freely into the water immediately after capture shall be considered part of the fisher's angler's daily bag limit and shall not be released after such possession.

SECTION 7. NR 21.11(1)(j) is repealed.

SECTION 8. NR 22.06(3) is amended to read:

NR 22.06(3) Any fish taken and retained in possession that is not released freely into the water immediately after capture shall be considered part of the fisher's angler's daily bag limit and may not be released after such possession.

SECTION 9. NR 22.11(11) is repealed.

SECTION 10. NR 23.05(2) is amended to read:

NR 23.05(2) Unless immediately released, Any fish taken and retained in possession that is not released freely into the water immediately after capture shall be included as considered part of the angler's daily bag limit.

SECTION 11. NR 26.01(63)(a) is repealed.

SECTION 12. NR 26.08(14)(a) is amended to read:

NR 26.08(14)(a) Beaver Dam creek. That portion of Beaver Dam creek from county highway G bridge in the NW1/4 of the NE1/4, section 17, township 12

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north, range 13 east, upstream downstream to the mouth at Beaver Dam lake outlet in the SW1/4 of the SW1/4, section 9, township 12 north, range 13 east.

SECTION 13. NR 26.09(63)(a) is created to read:

NR 26.09(63) VILAS COUNTY. (a) Manitowish river. Beginning at the dam across the Manitowish river located in section 9, township 42 north, range 5 east, commonly known as the Rest Lake dam, and extending downstream for a distance of 500 feet.

SECTION 14. NR 26.21(44)(a) is amended to read:

NR 26.21(44)(a) Tomahawk river. That part of the Tomahawk river beginning from the Cedar Falls dam Wisconsin Valley Improvement Company bridge in the NE1/4 of the NE1/4, section 27, township 38 north, range 5 east, downstream from said dam for a distance of 500 feet.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on January 24, 1996.

The rule shall take effect the first day of the month following publication as provided in s. 227.22(2)(intro.), Stats.
