REVISION OF THE GENERAL ORDERS ON SANITATION

Issued by

Industrial Commission of Wisconsin

Pursuant to Section 101.01 to 101.29, inclusive, the Industrial Commission on December 28, 1955, voted to repeal General Safety Orders Nos. 2200 to 2303, inclusive, known collectively as the General Orders on Sanitation and to adopt new General Safety Orders Ind 22.001 to Ind 22.253, inclusive, as follows:
