TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

I, Helen E. Gill, Secretary of the Industrial Commission of Wisconsin, and custodian of its official records, hereby certify that on March 10, 1958, the Industrial Commission amended rule Ind 70.11 (4) Hours of labor of minors between the ages of 14 and 18 years by adding the words, "who are high school graduates or married."

The rule as amended will read as follows:

Ind 70.11 Hours of labor of minors between the ages of 14 and 18 years.


(4) High School Graduates or Married Minors

(a) Boys 16 to 18 years of age, who are high school graduates or married, may be employed the same schedules as boys 18 years of age or over.

(b) Girls 16 to 18 years of age, who are high school graduates or married, may be employed the same total daily and weekly hours as women 18 years of age or over.

The commission also voted to repeal orders Ind 70.06 Camps, Mixed, and Ind 70.07 Fairs held by agricultural associations, societies or boards, inasmuch as Sec. 103.69 Wis. Statutes was amended in 1957 so that the above orders are not necessary.
