CHAPTER H 60

REGISTRATION OF SANITARIANS

H 60.01 Minimum qualifications of applicants for registration by examination

H 60.02 Examination

H 60.03 Renewal of certificate

H 60.04 Reciprocity

<u>H 60.01</u> Minimum qualifications of applicants for registration by examination. (1) TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE. Applicants shall submit evidence of completion of one of the following combinations of training and experience.

(a) A baccalaureate in public health sanitation and one year of acceptable employment as a sanitarian.

(b) A baccalaureate in a science course and two years of acceptable employment as a sanitarian.

(c) A baccalaureate in a non-science course and three years of acceptable employment as a sanitarian.

(d) Two years' training at an accredited college and four years of satisfactory experience as a sanitarian.

(e) High school graduation and six years of satisfactory experience as a sanitarian.

(2) REFERENCES. Applicant shall provide two acceptable references, not relatives, who can indicate his competence in the field of environmental sanitation.

<u>H 60.02</u> Examination. Applicant shall pass an examination conducted by the Examining Committee. (Section 140.45 (4), Wisconsin Statutes) Examinations will be conducted at least semi-annually. At least two weeks' notice of examination shall be given to qualified applicants. Any candidate for registration may appeal from the findings of the Examining Committee by appearing in person before the Committee. Request for appeal shall be filed in writing within 30 days of notification of the results of the examination. Examination papers may be destroyed after the 30-day appeal period. <u>H 60.03</u> Renewal of certificate; delinquency and reinstatement. Renewal of the certificate of registration is required by January 1 of each year. If the renewal application and fee of \$5.00 are not submitted by January 1, the certificate of registration shall be revoked automatically. Reinstatement within the next twelve months shall be effective on payment of the \$5.00 renewal fee. Reinstatement after a twelve-month period shall be subject to the filing of a new application for registration and payment of the \$10.00 application fee, except that a certificate which has been revoked for a period of five or more years shall be reinstated only after filing a new application, payment of the \$10.00 application fee and passing a written examination.

<u>H 60.04</u> Reciprocity. Reciprocal agreements may be entered into with states having equivalent qualification and examination requirements for registration.
