ORDER OF THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN ADOPTING,
AMENDING AND REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by sections 29.085, 29.174, 29.107 and 23.09, Wisconsin Statutes, the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby repeals, amends and adopts rules as follows:

Section WCD 10.01 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read

WCD 10.01 OPEN AND CLOSED SEASONS. A closed season is established for each species of wild animal and bird named herein extending during all the time of each year except the open season period embraced within the specified dates, both inclusive, and except as otherwise expressly provided, no person shall take, catch, kill, hunt, pursue, or trap any wild animal or bird at any time other than the open season and established hunting hours therefor, nor in the open season in excess of the daily bag limit designated for each species or each locality respectively, nor have any such protected wild animal or bird in his possession or under his control in excess of the possession limit.

WCD 10.06 (2) The hunting hours for each species of game, except deer, bear, migratory waterfowl and shorebirds, on which an open season is established (except raccoon and all wild animals for which there is no closed season established for which there are no hunting hour restrictions) shall be from one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour before sunset as listed in the following table and it shall be unlawful for any person to hunt or shoot such game on any day during the open season before the time listed in the AM column or after the time listed in the PM column.

(4) No person shall have in possession any firearm in territory wherein there is an open season for deer with firearms for a period of three days prior to the opening date for deer hunting unless the firearm is unloaded and enclosed within a carrying case, except that waterfowl hunters shall be permitted to hunt waterfowl continually during the open season.

(d) Hunters must register in person for permits (arm bands) at the hunter check stations, and must submit their hunting licenses and corresponding deer and back tags for inspection. Persons having already tagged a deer during the general season will not be allowed to participate in this hunt.

(e) A service fee of \$1.00 per person per trip shall be paid by each person.

(f) When finished hunting, each hunter must surrender in person his numbered arm band at the checking station through which he entered, and then submit for examination such game as he may have bagged, not later than 5:30 pm.

(2) Horicon managed gun deer hunt. (a) Deer of any age and either sex and fox may be taken with smooth-bore muzzle-loading muskets of not less than .45 caliber and shotguns loaded with single slug or ball within the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge (except posted closed areas), subject to provisions of this section, beginning on December 27 and continuing until the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife determines that the harvest of deer is such that to kill additional deer would be detrimental to and would endanger the breeding stock and future supply of deer; but not after December 28.

(b) Hunting on the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge is permitted under permit (arm band) only, as authorized by the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife. The number of permits issued at any one time shall not exceed 250, and a permit shall be valid for one day only. In order to assure better hunter distribution, entry to the refuge shall be at designated access points only. Daily hunting hours shall be from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.

(c) Reservations. Reservations for hunting in the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge may be obtained under the following conditions.

1. Reservation requests by mail only on official application forms will be accepted at the Wisconsin Conservation Department, Madison. Such requests may be postmarked no earlier than October 25 and no later than October 29. Applications which are post-marked before or after this period will be rejected.

2. Only one official application form per person may be submitted and anyone found submitting more than one application for a reservation shall have all applications rejected,

3. Selection of mailed application forms shall be made on the basis of a random drawing from all eligible applications. Reservations are not transferable and the person whose name appears on the reservation must present the reservation in person at the designated check station.

4. A reservation will entitle the applicant to bring not more than one guest with him.

5. Not more than one reservation per season may be obtained by mail by any one applicant, and only one permit per person is allowed. Hunting licenses shall be marked to show a permit,

(d) Hunters must register in person for permits (arm bands) at hunter check stations, and must submit their hunting licenses and corresponding deer tag and back tag for inspection. Persons having already tagged a deer during the regular season will not be allowed to participate in this hunt.

(e) Arm bands to hunt on the refuge are non-transferable. Reservations shall be valid until 8:00 am of the date indicated.

(f) A service fee of \$1.00 shall be paid by each person who hunts.

(g) Permits not used for reservations or made available when hunters check out will be issued on a first come-first served basis. Hunters must form a line with their automobiles to apply for these permits, and trailers and busses will not be permitted in line. Automobiles in line must be occupied at all times by persons without reservations desiring to apply for permits.

(h) When finished hunting, each hunter must surrender in person his numbered arm band at the checking station through which he entered and then exhibit for examination such game as he may have bagged, not later than 5:30 pm of the day for which his permit is valid.

(3) Horicon managed pheasant hunt. (a) An open season is established for hunting cock pheasants, cottontails, jackrabbits, gray and fox squirrels, raccoon, red and gray fox, and opossum, with shotguns or bow and arrow, within the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge (except posted closed areas), subject to the provisions of this section, beginning December 12 and continuing until the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife determines that the harvest of pheasants is such that to kill additional pheasants would be detrimental to and would endanger the breeding stock and future supply of pheasants; but not after December 16. Daily bag limits and other general hunting regulations for all game will apply as stated elsewhere in this chapter.

(b) Hunting on the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge is permitted under permit (arm band) only, as authorized by the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife. The number of permits issued at any one time shall not exceed 500, and a permit shall be valid for one day only. Daily hunting hours shall be from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.

(c) Reservations. Reservations for hunting in the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge may be obtained under the following conditions.

1. Reservation requests by mail only on official application forms will be accepted at the Wisconsin Conservation Department, Madison. Such requests must be postmarked no earlier than October 27 and no later than October 31. Applications which are postmarked before or after the above period will be rejected.

2. Only one application form per person may be submitted and anyone found submitting more than one (1) application for a reservation will have all applications rejected.

3. Selection of mailed application forms will be made on the basis of a random drawing from all eligible applications. Reservations are not transferable and the person whose name appears on the reservation must present the reservation in person at the designated check station.

4. A reservation will entitle the applicant to bring not more than one (1) guest with him.

5. Not more than one (1) reservation per season may be obtained by mail by any one applicant. Hunters shall be allowed one (1) permit and may be permitted to hunt thereafter only if no other hunters are waiting in line to apply. Hunting licenses shall be marked for each permit.

6. All reservations for any one day will be valid only up to 8:00 am.

(d) Hunters must register in person for permits (arm bands) at hunter check stations, and must submit their hunting licenses for inspection. Arm bands to hunt on the Refuge are non-transferable.

(e) Permits not used for reservations or made available when hunters check out will be issued on a first come-first served basis. Hunters must form a line with their automobiles to apply for these permits, and trailers and busses will not be permitted in line. Automobiles in the line must be occupied at all times by persons without reservation desiring to apply for permit.

(f) A service fee of \$1.00 per person per trip shall be paid by each person.

(g) All pheasants taken while hunting under permit within the Refuge shall be tagged immediately when taken by the hunter with a special tag furnished with the permit. Unused tags must be returned to the checking station upon completion of the hunt.

(h) Permittees shall be allowed to use dogs.

(i) When finished hunting, each hunter must surrender in person, his numbered arm band at the checking station through which he entered, and then submit for examination such game as he may have bagged, not later than 5:30 pm.

(4) Horicon managed goose hunt. (a) The open season for hunting geese on the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge shall begin on October 15, and the open season on ducks on November 15. Daily shooting hours shall be one-half hour before sunrise to 2:00 pm.

The open season for hunting geese and ducks on the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge established by this section and the open season for hunting geese in Dodge and Fond du Lac counties established in s. WCD 10.01 (1) shall close on an earlier date when the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife and the Wisconsin Conservation Commission determine that the harvest of the Canada goose population in Dodge and Fond du Lac counties is such that to kill additional Canada geese would be detrimental

to and would endanger the breeding stock and the future supply of Canada geese or that the Canada goose population has migrated from the refuge to such an extent that operation of the managed hunting unit is no longer in the public interest and such closing shall take precedence over the provisions of said s. WCD 10.01 (1),

(b) Hunting on the managed hunting unit on the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge is permitted under permit only as authorized by the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife.

(c) Hunting on such refuge shall be done only under the following conditions:
The Horicon National Wildlife Refuge is divided into 2 units as follows:

1. Managed hunting unit. The managed hunting unit varies in width, but is not more than 440 yards wide as marked by single strand of wire, or as posted by the Wisconsin Conservation Department. A single row of blinds spaced approximately 200 yards apart shall be provided by the Wisconsin Conservation Department to accommodate not more than three hunters per blind.

2. Refuge unit. The refuge unit shall include all land in the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge not designated above as the managed hunting unit. Within this unit, it shall be unlawful to hunt in any manner at any time.

3. Reservations. Reservations for hunting in the managed hunting unit may be obtained under the following conditions:

(a) Reservation requests by mail only on official application forms will be accepted at the Wisconsin Conservation Department, Madison. Such requests must be postmarked no earlier than August 25, and no later than August 29. Applications which are postmarked before or after the above period will be rejected.

(b) Only one official application form per person may be submitted and anyone found submitting more than one (1) application for a reservation will have all applications rejected.

(c) Selections of mailed application forms will be made by random drawing from all eligible applications submitted.

(d) Reservations are not transferable and the person whose name appears on the reservation must present the reservation in person at the designated check station. A reservation will entitle the applicant to bring not more than two (2) guests with him.

(e) Only one reservation by mail per applicant may be obtained. Hunters are not limited in the number of permits as guests of a reservation holder, however, hunters in the waiting line shall be allowed only three (3) permits and may be permitted to hunt thereafter only if no other hunters are waiting in line. Hunting licenses shall be marked for each of said three permits from the waiting line.

(f) All reservations for any one day will be valid only up to one-half hour before the daily shooting time.

4. Managed hunting unit prohibitions. Within the managed hunting unit it shall be unlawful to:

(a) Enter without first having obtained the necessary permit (arm band) in person at one of the checking stations. Such permit shall be valid for only one day.

(b) Leave the immediate vicinity of the managed hunting unit without first surrendering the permit in person at the checking station where it was obtained. The immediate vicinity of the managed hunting unit is defined as the special area in which the 2 PM closing hour is in effect and is described as follows:

Beginning in the city of Waupun at the junction of U. 5. Blinds will be assigned in numerical sequence at the time reservations are drawn. Reservation confirmations will contain assigned blind number. Vacant blinds will be issued on a first come-first served basis.

6. Hunters without reservations must form a line to apply for blinds, and trailers and busses will not be permitted in the line. Automobiles must be occupied at all times by persons without reservations desiring to register for blinds.

7. Hunters must register in person for blinds, and must submit their hunting licenses for inspection.

8. Arm bands to hunt on the unit are non-transferable and no permittee shall occupy or shoot from any other than his assigned blind.

9. Hunters may use their own decoys.

10. A service fee of three dollars per blind per trip shall be paid by each party. A party consists of from 1 to 3 hunters.

11. Hunters must keep their guns unloaded and enclosed in a carrying case at all times except while occupying assigned blinds.

12. Dogs are not allowed on the managed hunting unit.

13. No person shall leave any refuse in any blind or in the managed hunting unit, and immediately upon terminating his hunting trip shall deposit all refuse in containers provided at managed hunting unit access points.

14. When finished hunting, each hunter must surrender, in person, his numbered arm band at the checking station through which he entered, and there submit for examination such game as he may have bagged, not later than 3:30 pm.

15. Hunters must park at designated access points and driving to and from blinds is prohibited.

(5) Except as provided in s. WCD 10.15 (1) (2) (3) (4) and (6), no person shall take, catch, kill, hunt, trap, or pursue in any manner any species of wild animals or birds at any time or have in possession or under control any firearm unless the same is unloaded and enclosed within a carrying case or any bow and arrow unless the same is unstrung or enclosed within a carrying case upon that area known as the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge.

(6) Hunting and trapping. (a) Within the discretion of the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, an open season for trapping muskrat, mink and raccoon within the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge may be declared under written permit from the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife or its authorized representative and with the approval of the conservation director between the dates of October 25 and the succeeding April 15. Open seasons for hunting or trapping all other fur-bearing animals within the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge may be declared in the same manner at any time during the state season on such fur-bearing animals. Such permits shall be subject to all other rules and regulations governing hunting and trapping set forth in this chapter except that the use of not more than 125 traps and the use of wet or dry sets may be authorized by such permits.
