TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETINGS:

I, Helen E. Gill, Secretary of the Industrial Commission of Wisconsin and custodian of the official records of commission, do hereby certify that on August 18, 1958, the Industrial Commission voted to revise order Ind 35.19 of the General Orders on Safety in Construction. This ^{revison} ~~amendment~~ will become effective on the 1st day of the month following its publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Code, namely October 1, 1958.

The rule as revised will read as follows:

~~EXCERPT FROM THE WISCONSIN INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION GENERAL ORDERS ON SAFETY IN~~
CONSTRUCTION

Ind 35.19 Ladder jack scaffolds. (1) All ladder jacks shall be of a type approved by the industrial commission and shall be so designed that they will bear on the side rails when used on wood ladders and shall be clamped or otherwise securely fastened to the ladder. Ladder jacks not bearing on the side rails may be used on the rungs of metal ladders or on the rungs of wood ladders which are reinforced with a metal bar or rod extending through the side rails.

(2) Every ladder jack scaffold shall be composed of 2 ladders, 2 ladder jacks and a platform plank not less than nominal 2" x 10". Where lap planks are used, the planks shall be supported at each lap by a ladder jack attached to a separate ladder.

(3) Ladder jack scaffolds shall not be used at a greater height than 35 feet above the ground or working level.

(4) The use of each ladder jack scaffold is restricted to not more than 2 persons and not more than 70 pounds of material or equipment shall be permitted on the scaffold at any one time.

(5) All ladders used in conjunction with ladder jacks shall conform to the requirements set forth under paragraphs (1) to (4), inclusive, of section Ind 35.25.

Note - See Ind 35.20 for additional scaffolding requirements.
