ORDER OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE  
AMENDING, ADOPTING AND REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Department of Agriculture by sections 93.07 (1) and 94.08, Wis. Stats., the State Department of Agriculture hereby amends, adopts and repeals rules as follows:

SECTION 1. Section Ag 5.01 (14) of the Wisconsin administrative code is repealed.

SECTION 2. Section Ag 5.01 (15) of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended to read:

Ag 5.01 (15) State aid will not be allowed on horse pulling contests.

SECTION 3. Section Ag 5.01 (20) of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended to read:

Ag 5.01 (20) Fairs shall publish sections Ag 5.01 and Ag 5.03 in their premium books.

SECTION 4. Section Ag 5.02 (1) (a) 2 of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended by adding thereto the following:

Steer, junior yearling 9-7-5-4

Steer, summer yearling 9-7-5-4

Section Ag 5.02 (1) (a) 2 is further amended by striking the comma and the words "both sexes" following the term "Pair of calves".

SECTION 5. Section Ag 5.02 (1) (a) 3 of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended by adding thereto the following:

Barrow 7-5-3-2

Pen of barrows 5-4-3-2

Pen of 3 feeder pigs, 40 to 60 lbs. each 5-4-3-2

SECTION 6. Section Ag 5.02 (1) (a) 4 of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended by adding thereto the following:

Market lamb 5-4-3-2

Pen of market lambs 5-4-3-2

SECTION 7. Section Ag 5.02 (1) (b) 2-a of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended by adding thereto the following:

Pair of calves 6-5-4-3 6-5-4-2

SECTION 8. Section Ag 5.02 (1) (b) 2-b of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended by adding thereto the following:

Pair of steer calves 6-5-4-3 6-5-4-3

SECTION 9. Section Ag 5.02 (1) (b) 3-b of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended to read:

Ag 5.02 (1) (b) 3 b. Market classes (Regular or Danish judging).

Barrow 5-4-3-2

Pen of barrows 5-4-3-2

Pen of 3 feeder pigs, 40 to 60 lbs. each 5-4-3-2

SECTION 10. Section Ag 5.02 (1) (b) 4-b of the Wisconsin

administrative code is amended to read:

Ag 5.02 (1) (b) 4 b. Market classes (Regular or Danish judging).

Lamb (ewe or wether) 4-3-2-1

Pen of lambs 4-3-2-1

SECTION 11. Section Ag 5.02 (1) (b) 6 of the Wisconsin administrative code is adopted to read:

Ag 5.02 (1) (b) 6. Pleasure horses. State aid allowed on premiums paid to exhibitors in classes of ponies, light horses and horsemanship shall not exceed \$5 for any place, nor a total of \$186 for all classes.

SECTION 12. Section Ag 5.02 (2) (a) of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended to read:

Ag 5.02 (2) (a) In all prescribed classes that do not specify any breed, there may be separate classes for any recognized breeds, and state aid in the amounts prescribed will be allowed for such classes in each breed.

SECTION 13. Section Ag 5.02 (2) (b) of the Wisconsin administrative code is repealed.

SECTION 14. Section Ag 5.02 (2) (f) of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended to read:

Ag 5.02 (2) (f) State aid for premiums awarded for horses in open classes shall be limited to horses which are owned by the exhibitor and are the offspring of the exhibitor's mare or stallion.

SECTION 15. Sections Ag 5.02 (2) (g) and (h) of the Wisconsin administrative code are adopted to read:

Ag 5.02 (2) (g) The total of the maximum premiums prescribed for the places in any open class of livestock (except poultry) may be divided into premiums for a greater number of places and the maximum premium for any additional place shall be not higher than the maximum prescribed for the last place in such class.

(h) When there are 16 or more animals entered in any junior fair class, at the discretion of the fair the class may be divided into two approximately equal groups and each group judged as a class.

SECTION 16. Sections Ag 5.02 (3) (b) 1-a and 3-c of the Wisconsin administrative code are amended to read:

Ag 5.02 (3) (b) Group classes. 1. Dairy and beef cattle.  
a. An aged herd shall consist of 1 bull any age, 1 cow over 3 years old, 1 cow 2 to 3 years old, 1 heifer 1 to 2 years old, and 1 heifer under 1 year old, all of which shall be owned by the exhibitor.

3 c. A pen of market lambs shall consist of 2 lambs, wethers or ewes, which are owned by the exhibitor.

The rules and repeals contained herein shall take effect on May 1, 1960.
