ORDER

OF THE

STATE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WELFARE ADOPTING RULE 60.03

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Department of Public Welfare by sections 46.014 (3), 46.03 (1) and (2), and 46.05 (2), Wis. Stats., the State Department of Public Welfare hereby adopts Rule PW-MH 60.03, as follows:

TRAFFIC AND COMMING OF SCHOOLSE STORESTS CENTRAL CONTINUE CONCOL PROPERTY

- (1) DEFINITIONS, Indees the context otherwise requires:
 - (a) Tepartment? shall be interpreted to man the Visconeir State Department of Public Welfore
 - (b) "Colony" shall be interpreted to mean the Southern Wisconsin Golony and Training School located at Veion Grove
 - (c) "Superinterdent" shall be interpreted to mean the Superintendent of the Southern Wisconsin Colony and Training School
 - (4) "Road" skall be interpreted to mean driveways, courts, circles, drives, and lawes.
- Superintendent as to the actory property shall be constituted colony police officers and shall have the power to enforce those rules and regulations, and for the purposes thereof shall colles the properties under their respective jurisdictions. Such police officers shall have all the powers provided in Section 46.05 (2), Wis. Stats., except where such powers are specifically limited or modified by the Superintendant or by the Separateent. Said police officers shall be identified by an appropriate shald or bedge bouring the words "Colony Police Officer" and bearing a number, and much bedge shall be conspicuously worn when enforcing these rules and regulations. Such police officers may wern motor vehicle operators regarding defective equipment and require the owners to have the defects repaired.
- way be appointed to endure these rules and regulations. Such afficers shall have all the pureus provided to Section \$6.05(2), Wis. States, except where such powers are specifically Limited or acdified by the Superintendent or the Department.

 Officers appointed untar hide subsection are not required to year uniforms and consist of personnel perfecting their usual employment. Said officers shall carry an appropriate trains or shield bearing the words "Colony Police Officers" and bearing a number, and such being chall be conspicuously shown when optoroting these regulations.

- (3) MOTOR VEHICLE REGULATIONS. (a) 1. No person not holding a valid and current operator's license issued under Chapter 343, Wis. State., shall operate any motor vehicle on any roadway, driveway, or parking lot of the colony unless exempt under the provisions of Section 343.05 (2) Wis. State., from the requirement that he hold such a license in order to operate a motor vehicle on the highways of this State, and no person shall operate a motor vehicle on said grounds except on what clearly appears to be driveways, roadways, or parking lot.
- 2. Ho person shall operate any motor vehicle on any driveway, readway, or parking lot of the colony valess the same has been properly registered as provided by Chapter 301. His. State. valess anampt under an applicable provision of Section 30.05, Nis. State. From the requirement their the vehicle he registered in order Nuch it may be operated on the highways of this State.
- (b) All provisions of Theorem Mo, Who, Whole, orbited Tales of the Road", which are applicable to highways on defined in Section Mc.Cl (22), Wis. States, are horeby adopted for Var regulation of kraftin on the roadways and driveways under the control of the Sectionalent except as follows:

 - 3. Sections Mrs. 51 through The The Man Chatan
- (A) FARRING. (a) Parkin to prohibited at all times on the followy grounds; resimply, and drivesops except that the Superintendent of the colony is authorized to establish necessary parking eress in the properties under his jurisdiction, including areas having parking spaces reserved for specified persons and areas as appropriate and cafe for parking for specific ercups at specific times, providing such press are properly posted.

- (b) Parking in any reserved parking area is prohibited to persons other than those specifically assigned to such area by the Superintendent; and motor vehicles so assigned to any of the reserved parking areas shall be identified by an appropriate parking permit affined to the rear humper of vehicle so designated by the Superintendents.
- (c) Parking is prohibited at all times in areas which must be kept clear for the passage of fire apparatus. Said areas shall be designated by the Superintendent by standard signs reading, "Fire Zone, No Parking At Any Time, Day or Night".
- (d) Parking is prohibited at all times in areas which must be kept clear for vehicles to load and unload. Such areas shall be designated by the Superintendent by standard signs reading, "Loading Lone, We Parking, Day or Night".
 - (e) Parking is prohibited at all times as follows:
 - l. In a driveway or service road
 - 2. In a firelane
 - 3. Across a line marking the outside limits of a perking stell
 - 4. Overtime in a some having a maximum designated time limit for parking
 - 5. In a stall already occupied in whole or in part by another motor vehicle
 - 6. In any designated area posted as a "No Parking" some
 - 7. Within four feet of the outside limits of any leading or unloading dock or zone.
 - 8. Across any crosswelk
 - 9. Within 10 feet in any direction of a fire hydraut
- (f) Motor vehicles parked in a restricted parking area without a permit, or motor vehicles parked in a fire zone, loading zone or no parking zone, or in a parking area at times when parking therein is probibited, and

unlicensed or partially dismanticed motor vehicles, or abandoned vehicles, may be towed off the premises and stored at the owner's expense.

- (5) TRAFFIC REGULATIONS. (a) As a safety measure, the maximum speed on the following driveways and readways on the colony property shall be:
 - 1. Fifteen miles per hour on all readways, at crosswalks or intersections with sidewalks and any place where patients are being escorted or walking in groups, and on readways designated as "courts", "circles", and "drives".
 - first intersection of Min Road from the Main Gate to the first intersection of Min Road and Atherton Drive. Twenty-five miles per hour on Fine Road from the Rear Gate to the intersection of Pine Road and Min Road.
 - (b) On the colony grounds, all vohicles shall now to a full and complete stop at the following intersections and places:
 - 1. Elm Road and Highway C (2)
 - 2. Elm Road and Atherton Drive (2)
 - J. Mn Rosd and Circle Drive (2)
 - 4. Ein Road and Cottage 7 Drive (1)
 - 5, Elm Road and Oak Street (1.)
 - 6. We need and Pine Road (l_l)
 - 7. Elm Road and Charry Street (1)
 - 8. Pine Reed and Spruce Street (2)
- (c) All trucking on the colony roads and grounds is prohibited, except for the purpose of delivery to the colony or few construction projects.
 - (d) The Superintendent shall cause to be installed shoudard "Stop" signs at the places specified in subsection (5) (b).

- (e) The Seperintendent shall cause properly places signs specifying the maximum speeds allowed on readways and driveways as specified in subsection (5) (a).
- (f) No operator of a motor vehicle may overtake and pass another moving motor vehicle upon the right.
- (6) CONSERVATION OF INSTITUTION LANDS. (a) The dumping of any wasts, trash, debris, or other rubbish on any colony property is prohibited, except only as may be specifically authorized by the Superintendent.
- (b) The removal of any shrubs, vegetation, wood, timber, rocks, stone, earth, or other products from the colony property is prohibited except only as may be specifically authorized by the Superintendent.
- (c) The removal, destruction or molestation of any bird, animal, and fish life within the boundaries of the colony property is prohibited, except as may be specifically authorized by the Superintendent to protect colony property or in cases wherein this provision conflicts with any order of the Wisconsin Conservation Commission, when such Commission is empowered to set; and in such cases of conflict said Commission order shall govern.
- (d) The presence of any dogs or cats is prohibited at all times, except those possessed by exployees housed on the grounds as approved by the Superintendent.
- (e) It shall be unlewful to break, toor up, mar, destroy, or defece any notice, tree, vine, shrub, flower or other vegetation, or dislocate any stones or disfigure natural conditions or destroy or damage in any way any other property, real or personal, within the boundaries of colony property.
- (7) CONDUCT ON COLUMN CROUNDS. (a) The lighting and use of fires on the colony grounds is prohibited except in such places so are set saids for this purpose and appropriately designated by standard signs. It shall be unlawful to throw away any eightette, eight, pipe ashes, or other burning material without first extenguishing them.

- (b) All canvasuing, peddling, or soliciting shall be prohibited on the grounds or in the buildings of the colony except that the business manager, with the consent of the Superintendent may authorize subscription, membership, and ticket sales solicitation by employee organizations and campaigns for charitable purposes at such times and in such manner as not to interfere with regular colony business and functions. Food or beverage concessions operated by private parties, employee groups, and organizations are prohibited unless operated as part of the Soda Bar and Snack Bar; unless part of a public event sponsored by an organization the proceeds of which are used for the benefit of patients.
- (c) As an anti-littering measure, the distribution of handbills, pamphlets, and other similar materials on the colony grounds or in the buildings is prohibited, except that employee organizations may be granted permission for such distribution by the Superintendent provided that the organization agrees in writing to distribute no unlawful material.
- (d) The erection, posting, or attaching of signs in or on any building or grounds of the colony is prohibited except on regular bulletin boards. The Superintendent is authorized to allow exceptions for temporary periods as may be required by circumstances.
- (e) Smoking is prohibited in all buildings housing patients or petient activities except for such areas as are designated for that purpose by the Superintendent.
- (f) Walking upon the roofs of any colony building is prohibited at all times except for construction and repair purposes and where emergency egrees to fire escape is necessary unless such roof has been specifically constructed to be walked upon.
- (g) The use of mobile public address systems for adverticing or other purposes upon colony property is prohibited at all times. The use of outdoor

stationary public address systems is prohibited at all times except that the Saperintendent is sutherized to permit the use of such equipment for special events.

- (h) Carrying or using firearms on colony property, except as required for police and military purposes, is prohibited unless otherwise suthorized by the Superintendent.
- (i) Drunkenness or disorderly conduct of any kind is prohibited. The use or possession of intoxicating liquor or bear is prohibited in the colony and on colony property, except in the private living quarters of employees.
- (8) PICNICKING ON COLONI GROUNDS. Plenicking is permitted on colony grounds only to patients and employees of the colony and their relatives and friends, and in such specific areas as are designated by the Superintendent to be picnic grounds. The Superintendent shall prescribe rules as to hours when picnics are parmitted, the building and quanching of fires, the disposal of garbage and other refuse, and such other precautionary and eafety measures as he deems necessary.
- (9) DUTIES OF COLONY POLICE OFFICERS AS TO PAROLEES. Police officers of the colony have the same authority to arrest a paroles of the colony on the colony grounds for a law violation as they have to arrest and other person for a law violation on such grounds, but if the violator is a paroles the police officer shall return the paroles to the proper cottage in the colony.
- (10) EXCESSIVE NOISE FROMIBITED. No person on or in any hospital property shall cause or make any loud, excessive or unusual noise in the operation or use of any radio, television, phonograph, or other mechanical or electrical sound-making or reproducing device, inclument, machine, or vehicle which loud, excessive or unusual solse shall disturb the confort, quiet, or repose of patients or employess of the colony.

- (11) HIGHWAYS. No provision of this rule applies to any highway as defined by Section 340.01 (22) Wis. States, which traverses, skirts, or intersects any portion of the colony property.
- (12) SEVERABILITY. The provisions of this rule are severable. If any provision of this rule is invalid, or if the application thereof to any person or circumstance is invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.
- (13) PENALTY. The penalties for violating these rules and regulations shall be provided in Section 946.73 of the Wisconsin Statutes.
