STATE CONSERVATION CONNICSION OF WISCONSIN

IN THE MAITER of repealing section WCD 26.01 (b) (b) Big Elk river and (c) Flambeau river (South Fork) and creating : Order No. F-932 pection WCD 26.01 (50) (a), (b) and (c) relating to the establishment of fish refugee in Price County.

ORDER OF THE STATE CONSERVATION CONMISSION OF WISCONSIN ADOPTING, ACEMDING ON NEPHALING MULIS

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by section 23.09, Wis. Stats., the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby repeals and creates rules as follows:

Section WCD 26.01 (k) (b) Big Elk river and (c) Flambeau river (South Fork) are repealed.

Section WCD 26,01 (50) is created to read:

- WCD 26.01 (50) Price county. (a) Jobe's dam. All that part of the Big Elk river beginning at the dan commonly known as Jobs's dan, located in section 14, township 37 north, range 1 west, and thence downstream for a distance of 500 feet.
- (b) Big Elk river. All that part of the Big Elk river beginning at the dem commonly known as the Weimer dam located in section 11. township 36 north, range 2 west, and thence downstream for a distance of 500 feet.
- (c) Flambeau river (South Fork). That part of the South Fork of the Flambeau river situated in section 26, township 10 north, range 3 east beginning at the dam in and across the South Fork of the Flambeau river in said section 26 at the outlet of Hound lake and commonly known as the Pike Lake dam and extending thence downstream for a distance of 500 feet.

The rules herein shall take effect on August 1, 1960.
