ORDER OF THE VISCORDIN BOARD OF VETERINARY EXAMINERS ADOPTING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the Visconsin Soard of Veterinary Examiners by section 150.04 (3), Vis. State., created by chapter 294, laws of 1961, the Visconsin Board of Veterinary Examiners hereby adopts rules as follows:

Chapter VE 2 of the Wisconsin administrative code is adopted to read:

Constant Villa

LICENSE QUALIFICATIONS AND PEES.

- VE 2.01 "Board" means the Wisconsin Board of Veterinary Examiners.
- VE 2.02 No person shall be granted a license to practice veterinary medicine unless he has attained the age of 21 years and has successfully passed an examination conducted by the board.
- VE 2.03 Applicants for license shall submit proof of graduation from a school of veterinary medicine approved by the board. Schools of veterinary medicine certified by the American Veterinary Medical Association are approved by the board. The board may specifically approve other schools on the basis of their curricula and academic standing.

VE 2.04 Applications for license shall be made on forms prescribed by the board and shall be accompanied by an examination fee of \$25 and the current annual license fee. After notification that his application has been accepted, failure of the applicant to appear for examination without good cause within one year or two consecutive examinations conducted by the board shall render the applicant ineligible for examination except upon reapplication accompanied by an additional examination fee.

VE 2.05 No license or renewal of license shall be issued except upon payment of the annual license fee. The annual license fee shall be \$25.

WE 2.06 Any person who fails to renew his license annually may be required to pass an examination before a license will be issued.

VE 2.07 If a license is revoked or suspended, no part of the license fee shall be refunded.

The rules contained herein shall take effect on December 1, 1961.
