## ORDER OF THE WISCONSIN STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY AMENDING RULE PHAR. 1.04

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State Board of

Pharmacy by Section 151.01, Wis. Stats., The Board hereby amends

its rules as follows:

Section Phar. 1.04 of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE

is amended by adding thereto subsection (8) as follows:

(8) There shall be provided in the prescription department the following:

One prescription balance capable of weighting { grain or less One set of accurate Apothecary weights, { grain to two drams One set of accurate Metric weights, 50 mg. to 20 gm. Graduates - measuring volumes up to at least 16 fluid ounces;

and from 1 cc. to at least 500 cc. consisting of

at least two each measuring 2 drams, 1 ounce and 4 ounces; one each measuring 8 ounces and 16 ounces. (graduates are to be of clear transparent glass; those measuring volumes of 4 drams and less must be of the single scalecylindrical type; those measuring volumes greater than 4 drams may be either cylindrical or conical)

Mortars and Pestles - at least one glass 2 oz. and one glass 8 oz. Spatulas - stainless steel, at least three assorted sizes; and one non-metallic (rubber or bone). medium size

Funnels - glass, one 2 ounce, one 8 ounce Stirring Rods - glass, at least two A prescription numbering machine (duplicating)

Heating apparatus - tripod and bunsen burner or alcohol lamp; or, gas or electric plate

U.S. Pharmacopoeia (latest revision and supplements) National Formulary (latest revision and supplements) Exempt Narcotic, Foison and Hypodermic Syringe and Needle Registers Latest revision of Federal and State Pharmacy Laws consisting of:

## ORDER OF THE WISCONSIN STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY AMENDING RULE PHAR, 1.11

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State Board of Pharmacy by Section 161.08(1), Wis. Stats., the Board hereby amends its rules as follows:

Section Phar. 1.11 of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE is amended by adding thereto the following:

Exempted narcotic preparations are those medicinal preparations containing, along with therapeutically active nonnarcotic ingredients, in one fluid or avoirdupois ounce, not more than one grain of codeine or any of its salts, or along with either active or inactive non-narcotic ingredients of the type used in medicinal preparations, noscapine, papverine, narceine, cotarnine or nalorphine.

The amendment contained herein shall take effect on March 1, 1962 as provided in section 227.026.
