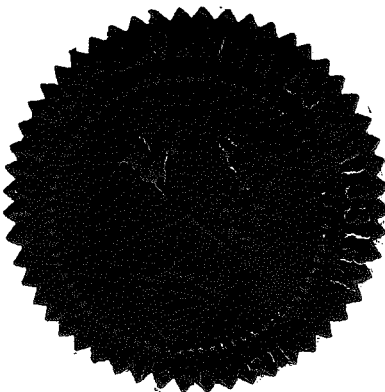

Sections WCD 20.04 (3) (b) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 20.04 (3) (b) Dip netting is permitted in any manner through the ice by dip nets not to exceed three feet in diameter or three feet square for all species of fish, but no person shall have more than twenty-five pounds and one fish of any species of game fish of any size in his possession. One dip net per person is permitted and such dip netting shall be carried on during the hours from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. in the following described waters only: Goose lake in Adams county; Summit lake in Ashland county; Devils and Mud lakes in Barron county; Totogatic lake in Bayfield county; Lizzie Paul's lake in Buffalo county; Big Doctor, Crystal, Elbow and North Frog lakes in Burnett county; County, Hallie, Hewitt, Knickerbocker, Loon, Plummer, Roedecker, Salisbury, S. Shattuck, and Town Line lakes in Chippewa county; Bass and Crystal lakes and Rockdale millpond in Dane county; Emily and Lost lakes in Dodge county; Dunnville Bottoms (excluding the Red Cedar river) in Dunn county; Price lake in Florence county; Mullet lake in Fond du Lac county; Rush lake in Fond du Lac and Winnebago counties; Heart and Maria lakes in Green Lake county; Town Line flowage in Jackson county; Castle Rock flowage in Adams and Juneau counties (except that part of the Yellow river arm of the Castle Rock flowage in Juneau county upstream from the county highway "G" bridge), Peterwell flowage in Adams, Juneau and Wood counties; Lilly and Montgomery lakes in Kenosha county; Spur lake in Oneida county; Silver Birch lake in Pepin county; Bass on highway #48, Coon, East, Little Horseshoe, McKeith (at Cushing), Rice and White Ash (north section) lakes in Polk county; Bass and Pleasant lakes in Portage county; Blockhouse, Gates, Island, LeTourneau, Perch, Riley, Sailor and Wintergreen lakes in Price county; Bowers and Grass lakes in Rock county; Bog, Bucks, Caley, #4 and Round lakes in Rusk county; Bushnell, Pine (at Baldwin), Three and Twin lakes in St. Croix county; Deer, Devils and Swamp lakes in Sawyer county; Kolpack and White lakes in Shawano county; Loraine, North,

Section WCD 20.04 (4) (d) 2 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 20.04 (4) (d) 2. Fishing in such waters shall be done only with hook and line or rod and reel. Bag limits, possession limits and size limits shall be the same as prescribed in the season tables except that from the Saturday nearest May 1 to February 15 there shall be a size limit of 22 inches on northern pike.

Section WCD 20.05 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read:

WCD 20.05 Season for crayfish and frogs. (1) CRAYFISH. There is no closed season on crayfish or crabs in the inland waters except in Manitowoc county where there is a closed season from March 1 to but not including the Saturday nearest June 15.

(2) METHOD OF TAKING. Crayfish or crabs may be taken in the following ways: by hand, minnow seines, minnow dip nets and minnow traps where the same are permitted for the taking of minnows (see minnow regulations, section WCD 20.10) and by crab traps with the entrance of the trap not to exceed $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter. Each such trap shall have securely attached to it a label or tag clearly bearing in the English language the name and address of the operator. All such traps shall be raised and the crayfish or crabs removed therefrom at least once in every 24 hours.

(3) FROGS. (a) The open season for taking, killing or capturing frogs shall be from the Saturday nearest May 1 to December 31.

(b) All frogs taken legally during the open season may be held, purchased, and sold during the closed season. Persons engaged in the business of propagating frogs may possess and sell frogs at any time.

(c) There shall be no open season for bullfrogs in Jefferson and Walworth counties.

Section WCD 20.07 (1) (e) and (4) (a) and (b) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code are amended to read:

WCD 20.07 (1) (e) No person shall use as bait any minnows or other fish in the following waters which are identified by posting: McCall lake in Adams and Marquette counties; Cammerer lake in Ashland county; Little Granite lake in Barron county; Beaver, Joanne, Long and Nymphia lakes, an unnamed lake in section 12, township 44 north, range 7 west, and an unnamed lake in section 20, township 44 north, range 9 west all in Bayfield county; Banach and Little Round lakes in Burnett county; Dark lake in Chippewa county; Stewart lake in Dane county; Anderson lake in Douglas county; Valley lake in Forest county; Horgan and Moraine lakes in Lincoln county; Bullhead lake in Manitowoc county; Big Twin, Icehouse and Pickerel lakes in Polk county; Patterson and Timms lakes in Price county; Three lakes in Rusk county; North Twin and Spruce lakes in Taylor county; Weber,

Sawmill, Tozer and West Lakes in Washburn County, and Washburn County.

(4) (a) No person shall have in his possession or under his control on any of the inland waters or shores of inland waters at any time any spear or similar device that might be used for the purpose of taking, catching or killing fish in the counties of Ashland (except in the Bad river), Barron (except as provided in WCD 20.07 (6)), Bayfield, Burnett, Douglas (except in the Amnicon and Nemadji rivers and the Black river upstream to the Soo Line bridge from December 15 to January 15, inclusive), Iron, Oconto in that portion of the county west of highway 141 only, Oneida, Pierce, Polk, Price, Rusk, Sawyer, Taylor, Vilas and Washburn (except as provided in WCD 20.07 (6) and except that rough fish may be taken with bow and arrow from Saturday nearest May 20 to July 1 each year in Barron, Burnett, Douglas, Iron and Polk counties and by spears in Burnett county from Saturday nearest May 15 to July 15 from sunrise to sunset).

(b) No person shall have in his possession or under his control any gun, bow and arrow, spear or similar device that might be used for the purpose of taking, catching or killing fish on any of the inland waters or shores of inland waters at any time from March 2 to April 20, inclusive, in the counties of Adams, Brown, Buffalo, Calumet (except during a sturgeon spearing season in any specified water), Chippewa, Clark, Columbia, Dane, Door, Dunn, Eau Claire, Florence, Fond du Lac (except during a sturgeon spearing season in any specified water), Forest, Jackson, Juneau, Kewaunee, La Crosse, Langlade, Lincoln, Manitowoc, Marathon (except that spearing is prohibited in the Big Eau Pleine flowage from the dam upstream to highway 97 from November 1 to April 20), Marinette, Monroe, Oconto in that portion of the county east of highway 141 only, Outagamie (except during a sturgeon spearing season in any specified water), Ozaukee, Pepin, Portage, St. Croix, Sauk, Shawano, Trempealeau, Walworth, Washington, Winnebago (except Waukau creek and during a sturgeon spearing season in any specified water) and Wood. It shall be lawful to take rough fish by means of spear or bow and arrow from sunrise to sunset in the inland waters of the counties or portions thereof named in this paragraph from April 21 through March 1, both dates inclusive, except in Calumet, Fond du Lac and Winnebago counties during a sturgeon spearing season in any specified water and as noted.

Section WCD 20.09 (2) (g) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

WCD 20.09 (2) (g) A dip net not exceeding 3 feet in diameter or 3 feet square may be used in all other waters at any time of the year, sunrise to sunset, for the taking of rough fish with no bag or possession limit except for suckers and redhorse for which there is a bag and possession limit of 25 in aggregate.

Section WCD 20.12 (10) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 20.12 (10) Set lines equipped with not more than 25 hooks and set or bank poles may be used from the Saturday nearest May 20 to October 15 in the following waters: The Wisconsin river from the north line of Sauk county to its mouth; the Black river downstream from the highway 12 bridge in the city of Black River Falls; the Blue river downstream from the highway "C" bridge in Grant county

from Saturday nearest May 20 to October 15 in the Pecatonica river in Green county and in the Grant river from Porter's bridge on highway #35 to its mouth in Grant county. On such set lines, or set or bank poles, it shall be unlawful for any person to use as bait, any frog, crayfish or fish or part thereof except that in the Wisconsin river from the Prairie du Sac dam downstream to its mouth, in the Grant river from Porter's bridge on highway #35 to its mouth, in the Pecatonica river in Green county; the Blue river downstream from the highway "C" bridge in Grant county, and in the Kickapoo river in Crawford county, from 200 feet below the dam at Gays Mills downstream to its mouth it shall be legal to use live bait of a minimum size of five inches or larger on set lines or set or bank poles. The bag and size limits established in the season tables shall apply.

Section WCD 20.15 (1) (f), (h) and (n), (2) (a) and (4) (b) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code are amended to read:

WCD 21.09 (5) No nets or set lines may be used or operated at any time within 900 feet below any dam on the Mississippi river; nor in the following closed areas from April 15 to the next following October 31 unless a contract or a permit is issued by the Conservation Commission: Lake Onalaska, the entire body of water created by the nine-foot channel dam at Onalaska, the lake extending northward from the dam to Brice Prairie and the extreme northern point of French island; Black river from Onalaska nine-foot channel dam to the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific railroad bridge immediately south of Copeland Park in the city of La Crosse; French lake, which is located on French island, lying opposite the city of La Crosse, between the Black river and east channel of the Mississippi river; Gravel pit and entire Bank Slough area from 13th Place in the city of La Crosse southeasterly to where it enters Running Slough; nor in the following closed areas at any time unless a contract or a permit is issued by the Conservation Commission: Lagoon, which is located on Pettibone island within the corporate limits of the city of La Crosse, the closed area to include also the waterway connecting the Lagoon proper with the Mississippi river; Goose lake, lying in Pierce county; and the Trempealeau lakes, known as Second, Third and Round lakes, lying in Trempealeau county; nor shall any gill nets be used or operated at any time in the following waters unless a contract or permit is issued by the Conservation Commission: Black river from the Onalaska nine-foot channel dam to the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific railroad bridge immediately south of Copeland Park in the city of La Crosse; French lake, which is located on French island, lying opposite the city of La Crosse, between the Black river and east channel of the Mississippi river; Gravel pit and the entire Bank Slough area

Section WCD 23.02 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read:

WCD 23.02 Seasons; limits. There are provided and established the following open and closed seasons, bag limits, size limits, possession limits and other fishing regulations for the several varieties and species of fish in the waters herein designated. A closed season is established for each variety of fish named herein extending during all the time of the year except the open season period embraced within the specified dates, both inclusive, and except as otherwise

expressly provided, no person or persons shall take, catch or kill fish of any variety, or fish by any means other than with hook and line; nor at any time other than the open season therefore; nor have in his possession or under his control any fish in excess of the daily creel or possession limit, or fish of less than the legal minimum size during the open season.

MEASUREMENT OF FISH. The measurement of all fish taken shall be in a straight line from the tip of the snout to the utmost end of the tail fin fully extended.

Section WCD 23.03 (1) and (2) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 23.03 Hook and line fishing. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to use or operate more than 2 lines or 2 poles with one line attached to each pole, and with a total not to exceed 4 hooks on either 1 or 2 lines, or to fish with any line or lines and hooks left in the water unattended.

(2) It shall be unlawful for any person to take, capture, or kill fish or fish for fish of any variety at any time in Lac Vieux Desert, Mamie, West Bay, Big and Tenderfoot lakes from a motor-driven boat when the motor is running or from any boat in tow of a motor-driven boat when the motor is running or from any sailboat when in motion.

Section WCD 23.05 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read:

WCD 23.05 Spears. (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to have in his possession or under his control from 8:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., central standard time, on any waters specified herein, except as otherwise provided herein, any spear, similar device or bow and arrow that might be used to take, catch or kill fish, or at any time on any waters containing trout or in which trout have been planted.

(2) Northern pike or pickerel, but no other species of fish, may be taken by means of spears through the ice from January 1 to February 15, inclusive, from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., central standard time, subject to the bag, possession and size limits prescribed for northern pike.

(3) Suckers, redhorse, carp, buffalo fish, dogfish, garpike, sheepshead, smelt and lawyers or burbot may be taken by means of spears from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., central standard time, only from May 1 to May 31, inclusive, in the waters of Menominee river above the Nathan Street Bridge.

(4) Cisco and whitefish may be taken by means of spears from October 15 to December 31, inclusive of each year, in the waters of Smoky lake. Such spearing may be done in either the daytime or at night and with the aid of artificial lights.

Section WCD 23.06 (1) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 23.06 Dip nets. (1) Dip nets may be used for taking suckers, redhorse, carp, buffalo fish, dogfish, garpike, sheepshead, smelt and lawyers or burbot from April 1 to May 14, inclusive, in the Menominee river, except that it shall be unlawful to use any dip net in that part of the Menominee river beginning at the upstream side of the Hattie Street Bridge in Marinette-Menominee and extending upstream to the first dam and within 200 feet below all other dams.

Section WCD 23.07 (3) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 23.07 (3) NAME OF OWNER. All buildings, tents, fish shanties and similar enclosures or shelters maintained, occupied, or used for fishing purposes on the ice of any inland boundary waters shall have the name and address of the person owning or using the same painted on the outside thereof in such manner as to be readily visible at all times.

Section WCD 26.01 (63) (d) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed.

Section WCD 26.21 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

WCD 26.21 Fish refuges. The following described areas are hereby created and established as fish refuges, and it shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, capture, kill or fish for fish in any manner from February 15 to April 15 both dates inclusive, in, on or along the following described water areas:

(11) Dodge county (a) Rock river (Hustisford dam). That part of the Rock river beginning at the Hustisford dam, in the village of Hustisford, and extending downstream for a distance of 725 feet.

Section WCD 26.22 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

WCD 26.22 Fish refuges. The following described areas are hereby created and established as fish refuges, and it shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, capture, kill or fish for fish in any manner from March 1 to April 15, both dates inclusive, in, on or along the following described water areas:

(66) Washington county (a) Milwaukee river (Newburg dam). That part of the Milwaukee river beginning at the Newburg dam in the town of Trenton and extending downstream for a distance of 300 feet.

The rules, amendments and repeals contained herein shall take effect on January 1, 1963.
