ORDER OF THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN ADOPTING,

AMENDING AND REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by sections 29.085, 29.107 and 23.09, Wisconsin Statutes, the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby repeals, amends and adopts rules as follows:

Section WCD 10.01 (4) (c) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read;

All that part of the state lying northerly of State Highway 64 ----- Feb. 6 through April 10

All that part of the state lying southerly of a line beginning at the junction of State Highway 82 with the west boundary of the state, thence easterly along said Highway 82 to its junction with State Highway 33, thence easterly along said Highway 33 to its junction with State Highway 73, thence southerly along said Highway 73 to its junction with State Highway 60, thence easterly along said Highway 60 to its junction with Ozaukee County Highway ${}^{\bar{n}}Q^{u}$, thence easterly along said Highway "Q" extended easterly to its junction with Lake Michigan which is the east boundary of the state

ZONE E

A special open season by permits for trapping beaver is established in the following described trout waters. The Wisconsin Conservation Department shall issue free permits to all licensed trappers requesting such permits to trap beaver in such waters. A maximum of 15 beaver tags shall be issued to each permittee and such tag must be affixed to the carcass of each beaver trapped under such permit immediately upon removing the carcass from the trap.

The opening date for the trapping season for otter shall be concurrent with the opening date for trapping beaver in all zones established under paragraph (c) of this section. The open season for trapping otter shall extend through March 15 in Zones A and B and through March 7 in Zone D. There shall be no open season in Zones C and E. The season bag limit is two otter.

The rules, amendments and repeals contained herein shall take effect on February 1, 1965.
