ORDER OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
AMENDING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Department of Agriculture by sections 94.45 and 94.46, Wis. Stats., the State Department of Agriculture hereby amends rules as follows:

Section Ag 20.10 of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended to read:

Ag 20.10 Fees. The fees for testing seed samples submitted to the state seed laboratory are based on costs of time and materials and are as indicated below. There are two tests: the purity analysis, which includes a noxious weed seed examination, and the germination test.

(3) Seed mixtures

The charge for seed mixtures (in which more than one kind of crop seed is present to the extent of 5% or more) is the total of (a) the fee for the kind of crop seed in the mixture having the highest fee and (b) 50% of the fees applicable to the other kinds in the mixture.
