ORDER OF THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION AND THE NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD OF WISCONSIN ADOPTING, AMENDING OR REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Conservation Commission and the Natural Resources Board of Wisconsin by sections 29.085 and 29.174, Wisconsin Statutes, and Chapter 75, Laws of 1967, they hereby adopt, amend and repeal rules as follows:

WCD 20.04 (4)(a)5 There is a continuous open season with no daily bag limit or size limit for all species of fish contained in these waters except in Escanaba lake there shall be a minimum size limit of 22 inches on northern pike and a daily bag limit of two splake on Pallette lake and a daily bag limit of ten trout in Nebish lake.

Section 9. WCD 20.04 (4)(b)1 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 20.04 (4)(b)1 Fishing in such waters is authorized from the second Saturday in May to September 15 under permit only which may be secured at the checking station indicated by posted signs in the immediate area.

Section 10. WCD 20.07 (1)(c) and (4)(a) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code are amended to read:

WCD 20.07 (1)(c) Any fisherman fishing through the ice with hook and line on Lake Winnebago in Calumet, Fond du Lac and Winnebago counties and Lakes Butte des Morts and Winnebago counties may fish with not more than three lines with not more than one hook attached to each line.

(4)(a) No person shall have in his possession or under his control in any of the inland waters or shores of inland waters at any time any spear or similar device that might be used for the purpose of taking, catching or killing fish in the counties of Ashland (except in the Bad river), Barron, Bayfield, Burnett, Douglas (except in the Amnicon and Nemadji rivers and the Black river upstream to the Minneapolis, St. Paul and Sault Ste. Marie railroad bridge from December 15 to January 15, inclusive), Iron, Oconto in that portion of the county west of highway #141 only, Oneida, Pierce, Polk, Price, Rusk, Sawyer, Taylor, Vilas and Washburn counties and except that rough fish may be taken with bow and arrow from the Saturday nearest May 20 to July1each year in Barron, Burnett, Douglas, Iron and Polk counties and by spears or by the method known as skin diving with the use of spears or spear guns in Burnett county from the Saturday nearest May 20 to July 1 from sunrise to sunset.

Section 11. WCD 20.12 (10) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 20.12 (10) Setlines equipped with not more than 25 hooks and set or bank poles may be used from Saturday nearest May 20 to October 15 in the following waters: the Wisconsin river from the north line of Sauk county to its mouth; the Black river downstream from the highway #12 bridge in the city of Black River Falls; the Blue river downstream from the highway "C" bridge in Grant county and the Kickapoo river in Crawford county. Set or bank poles only may be used from Saturday nearest May 20 to October 15 in the Chippewa river from the dam in Eau Claire to the Mississippi river, the Pecatonica river in Green and Lafayette counties, in the Grant river from Porter's bridge on highway #35 to

Section 15. WCD 21.09 (2) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

-WCD 21.09 (2) The following minimum size limit is hereby established for rough fish taken by licensed commercial fishermen: catfish, 20 inches except as otherwise herein provided; all other species of rough fish, no size limit or bag limit.

Section 16. WCD 22.05 (1) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 22.05 (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to use or operate more than two lines or two poles with one line attached to each pole and with one bait to each line, except that fly-fishermen may use two flies on one line, or with any fish line or lines unattended or by snagging or fouling in any manner, or by means other than angling or trolling except as otherwise provided by the Wicconsin Statutes or by Commission order. It shall be unlawful for any person to take game fish of any variety at any time by any means other than with hook and line, except as provided in this chapter.

Section 19. WCD 23.05 (3) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 23.05 (3) Suckers, redhorse, carp, buffalo fish, dogfish, garpike, sheepshead, smelt and burbot may be taken by means of spears from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., central standard time, only from May 1 to May 31, inclusive, in the waters of Menominee river above the Nathan Bridge.

Section 20. WCD 26.11 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed.

Section 21. WCD 26.12 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed.

The rules, amendments and repeals contained herein shall take effect on January 1, 1968.
