

ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD

ADOPTING, AMENDING AND REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the Acting Secretary of the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board by sections 29.174 (4a), 23.09 and 227.027, Wisconsin Statutes, in accordance with section WCD 10.01 (1) (f) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code, the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board hereby amends rules as follows:

Section WCD 10.01 (1) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read:

(g) The following described area is established as the Burnett County Zone:

All that part of Burnett County lying westerly of a line beginning at the junction of state highway 77 with the west boundary of said county, thence easterly along said highway 77 to its junction with state highway 35, thence southerly along said highway 35 to its junction with county highway V, thence westerly, southerly and easterly along said highway V to its junction with state highway 35, thence southerly along said highway 35 to its junction with state highway 70, thence westerly along said highway 70 to its junction with state highway 48, thence southerly along said highway 48 to its junction with state highway 87, thence southerly along said highway 87 to its junction with the south boundary of said county.

(h) The following described area is established as the Horicon Zone:

The Horicon Zone includes portions of Columbia, Dane, Dodge, Fond du Lac, Green Lake, Jefferson, Marquette, Waushara, Washington, Waukesha, and Winnebago counties, bounded on the north by state highway 21, on the east by U. S. highway 45 and state highways 175 and 83, on the south by U. S. highway 18, and on the west by state highway 73.

(i) The following described area is established as the Horicon Intensive Management Zone:

All that part of the counties of Dodge and Fond du Lac enclosed by a line beginning at the junction of state highway 26, with the east-west center line of section 9, 10, 11 and 12 in township 12 north, range 15 east, thence eastward along said center line and continuing eastward along the east-west center of sections 7, 8, 9 and 10 in township 12 north, range 16 east to its junction with county highway TW, thence north and east on said highway TW to its junction with county highway Y, thence northerly on said highway Y to its junction with county highway YY, thence northerly on said highway YY to its junction with county highway Y, thence northerly on said highway Y to its junction with county highway B, thence southwesterly on said highway B to its junction with county highway D, thence westerly on said highway D to its junction with highway AS, thence westerly on said highway AS to its junction with U. S. highway 151, thence southwesterly on said highway 151 to its junction with the C.M.St.P. & Pac. railroad, thence southerly along said C.M.St.P. & Pac. railroad to its junction with state highway 26, thence north on said highway 26 to its junction with the east-west center line of sections 9, 10, 11 and 12 in township 12 north, range 15 east which is the point of beginning.

(j) Canada goose hunting permit and tag:

1. Each person must have been issued and carry on his person a valid Canada goose hunting permit and tag issued by the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, U. S. Department of Interior, to hunt and kill Canada geese.

2. The goose tag must be securely locked about the leg of each Canada goose when it is reduced to possession. Such goose cannot be carried or transported in any manner without the tag being attached and locked. The tag must remain attached to the goose until it reaches the abode of the permit holder. The tag may not be reused.

3. A mandatory report on tag use or non-use, will be required to determine the harvest of Canada geese. Tag reports on forms furnished with the permit must be placed in the mail within 12 hours following tagging a goose, or, if the tag is not used during the valid period, within 12 hours following the close of the period for which the tag is valid. Unused tags must be returned with such report.

4. In the Horicon zone, the following hunting periods are established and a tag issued for this zone will be valid during one period only, as specified on the permit:

5. In the remainder of Wisconsin, excluding the Horicon zone, Canada goose hunting permits and tags will be valid for the full length of the Canada goose season established under paragraph (f).

Section WCD 10.15 (5) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 10.15 (5) Except as provided in subsections (2) (6) and (7), it shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch, kill, hunt, trap, or pursue any species of wild animal or bird at any time, or have in possession or under control any firearm unless the same is unloaded and enclosed within a carrying case or any bow and arrow unless the same is unstrung or enclosed in a carrying case, upon that area known as the Horicon National Wildlife Refuge. Nothing in this section shall prohibit, prevent, or interfere with the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife, its deputies, agents, or employees in the destruction of unprotected wild animals as listed in Wis. Adm. Code section WCD 10.04.

Section WCD 10.23 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed.

Section WCD 11.32 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

WCD 11.32 Closed area; state parks and recreation areas.

A closed season is established in posted areas within the exterior limits of the following state parks and recreation areas, and it is unlawful for any person to take, catch, kill, hunt or pursue any deer within the area so posted with Department of Natural Resources signs.

Section WCD 45.14 (4) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read:

WCD 45.14 (4) This section does not apply to deer hunting on state-owned lands in Rock Island State Park, Door County, Europe Bay State Park, Door County, Big Bay State Park Recreation Area, Ashland County, Wildcat Mountain State Park, Vernon County, Mirror Lake State Park Recreation Area, Sauk County, Devils Lake State Park, Sauk County, Lake Wissota State Park Recreation Area, Chippewa County, The Elroy-Sparta State Trail and the Tuscobia-Park Falls State Trail during the regularly established gun-deer season or the December bow and arrow deer season in the respective counties except for posted closed areas described in Section WCD 11.32.

The amendment contained herein shall take effect the day of publication in the official state paper as provided in section 227.027, Wisconsin Statutes, as an emergency rule. Facts constituting the emergency are as follows:


The waterfowl hunting regulations include the open season dates on woodcock. This season opens prior to October 1, consequently, this order must be processed as an emergency rule.

The preservation of the public safety and welfare necessitates the adoption of such rules as emergency rules.


