

ORDER OF THE

DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRY, LABOR AND HUMAN RELATIONS

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations by section 101.01 to 101.29, Wis. Stats., the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations hereby repeals, amends, and adopts rules as follows:

Section Ind 8.63 (4) of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE is adopted to read:


(4) AUTOMATIC DISPENSING UNITS. Underwriter's laboratories approved special dispensing devices such as, but not limited to, money operated, card operated, and remote preset types are permitted at service stations, provided that dispensing of Class I liquids is under the observation of an authorized attendant at all times and provided that emergency controls are installed at a location acceptable to the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations. Instructions for operation of dispensing devices shall be conspicuously posted.

(a) The observation and control of the special dispensing devices shall be the sole function of the attendant. The attendant shall be regularly instructed in all appropriate regulations pertaining to dispensing, use of approved containers, and smoking restrictions.

(b) A reliable two-way communication system shall be installed between the attendant's observation station and each set of pumps or island.

The rules, amendments, and repeals contained herein shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register as provided in section 227.026 (1).
