## ORDER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

Adopting, Amending, or Repealing Rules

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Superintendent of Public Instruction by Section 115.28(7), Wisconsin Statutes, he hereby repeals, amends, and adopts rules as follows:

Section PI 3.20(1) be repealed and recreated to read:

PI 3.20(1) SENIOR SCHOOL SOCIAL WORKER. A senior school social worker certificate may be issued to an individual who meets the requirements stipulated in paragraph (a), (b), or (c) of this section:

- (a) A master's degree in social work from an approved school of social work with one year of field experience in an approved school-affiliated unit and 18 semester hours of education or its equivalent. In addition, the individual must be recommended as to competency by the university certifying officer.
- (b) A master's degree in social work from an approved school of social work, 18 semester hours of education credit or its equivalent and one year of successful experience in a recognized social agency (dealing with children and youth).
- (c) A master's degree in social work from an approved school of social work, and an undergraduate degree in education which would allow the individual to be eligible for Wisconsin teacher certification.
- (d) Credits obtained in the social work course which the university's school of education will accept as equivalent to professional education credits will be accepted to a license in paragraphs (a) and (b).
- (e) The state superintendent may also determine equivalency.
