ORDER OF THE STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION AMENDING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in it by Sections 348.25, 348.26 and 348.27, Wisconsin Statutes, the Commission hereby repeals, amends, and adopts portions of Chapter Hy 30, Wisconsin Administrative Code, as follows:

Section Hy 30.01(3)(e)7 is amended as follows:

A load being transported under a permit may extend beyond the front or left fender line of the transporting vehicle or more than 6 inches beyond the right fender line of the transporting vehicle, provided that such overhang shall be reduced to the practicable minimum by suitable positioning of the load upon the vehicle subject to compliance with the requirements of subsection (3)(e)5. The wheels on one side of the transporting vehicle shall not carry more than 60% of the total gross load.

Section Hy 30.01(3)(e)16 is amended to read:

Permits shall not be valid during the hours of darkness nor during periods when adverse weather or road conditions such as fog, smoke, heavy rain, snow or ice, or the velocity of the wind impair the safety of a movement under the permit, nor during the period beginning at twelve noon on the day preceding and continuing until sunrise on the day following every Sunday and holiday as defined herein. Permits shall not be valid on Saturday morning from May 15 to September 15, inclusive, each year. Vehicles exceeding statutory size or weight limitations shall not be operated on the highway, whether loaded or empty, during those times when the permit is not valid.

- a. "Holiday" means January 1, May 30, July 4, December 25, the first Monday in September, and the fourth Thursday of November or the day appointed by the Governor as a day of public Thanksgiving each year.
- b. "Hours of darkness" are as defined in Section 340.01(23), Wis. Statutes.

Section Hy 30.01(3)(e)17 is amended to read:

A permit will not be issued for a vehicle and load exceeding 100 feet in overall length when the rear supporting axle or axles are at or near the rear of the load unless that rear support is steerable and steered.

Section Hy 30.01(3)(e)18 is amended to read:

A permit is valid only for the vehicle described upon the face of the application and permit, except that on single trip permits for certain types of towed vehicles such as office trailers, art galleries, and banks, and on mobile home single trip permits, the towing vehicle need not be specifically identified, but the application shall state that the towing unit meets the requirements of the condition which states that "the towing vehicle shall be a truck of not less than 1 1/2 tons manufacturer's rated capacity and shall be equipped with dual wheels on the drive axle."

Section Hy 30.01(3)(e)22 is amended and renumbered as follows:

Hy 30.01(3)(e)21: Notwithstanding the height or width limitations which may be authorized by an individual permit, no vehicle or combination of vehicle and load exceeding 13 1/2 feet in height or 12 feet in width or which by reason of slow speed or other characteristic is likely to unduly interfere with normal traffic may be operated or transported upon any completed portion of the Interstate Highway System unless a different height or width is specifically allowed by the permit.

Section Hy 30.01(3)(e)22 is created as follows:

No permit is valid on any part of the Milwaukee County Expressway System constructed pursuant to Section 59.965, Wisconsin Statutes, except on U.S. Highway 45 between West Florist Avenue and West Silver Spring Drive.

Section Hy 30.02(1)(d) is amended to read:

Upon the receipt of satisfactory application for transport over a state trunk highway and provided the proposed transport meets the Commission's requirements and limitations as set forth in these rules, a permit may be issued by mail or, if requested, by collect telegram or teletype message in the form approved by the Commission by either the main or district office of the Commission. Permits issued on applications in writing or by telegram or teletype may be made valid for a maximum period of two weeks. Such permits may be extended for another period of not more than two weeks. All permits are limited to one extension. Expired permits which have not previously been extended may be reinstated upon request in writing or by telegram or teletype which shall specify the number of the permit to be reinstated, provided the request is made no more than three days after the date of expiration. Such reinstatement shall be for a period of not more than two weeks.

When the permitted load exceeds the size and weight limitations in (1) above:

In addition to the above, \$200,000 casualty insurance in the required form, for each accident is required if the permitted load exceeds 16 feet in width, or 100 feet in length.

Section Hy 30.02(5) Introductory Paragraph is amended as follows:

GENERAL CONDITIONS. Special permits are issued subject to the general conditions set forth in Wisconsin Administrative Code subsections Hy 30.01(3)(e) 1,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10,11,12,13,14,15,16,17,18,19,20,21 and 22 and the following:

Section Hy 30.02(5)(e)2 is amended to read:

Permits for mobile homes are valid only from sunrise to sunset and shall not be valid during periods when adverse weather or road conditions such as fog, smoke, heavy rain, snow or ice or the velocity of the wind impair the safety of a movement under a permit, nor at any other times when there is not sufficient natural light to render clearly visible any person or vehicle upon a highway at a distance of 500 feet, nor during the period beginning at 12 noon on the day preceding and continuing until sunrise on the day following every holiday as defined herein. "Holiday" means January 1, May 30, July 4, December 25, the first Monday in September, and the fourth Thursday of November or the day appointed by the Governor as a day of public Thanksgiving each year.

Section Hy 30.03(1)(a), last sentence is amended to read:

The forms shall provide space for the signature of the applicant or his authorized agent and for the date of the application.

Section Hy 30.04(3)(b) is amended to read:

Annual permits shall not be issued for house trailers, mobile homes, travel trailers or camper trailers.

Section Hy 30.04(3)(c) is created to read:

Annual permits may be issued for self-propelled carry-all scraper, provided that no single axle may exceed 35,000 pounds.

Section Hy 30.04(5)(f) is amended to read:

Annual permits do not authorize the operation of more than two vehicles in combination except that an earth mover may be transported with its power unit resting upon the bed of a semi-trailer and its single rear axle trailing on the roadway behind the semi-trailer, in which case the gross weight of the rear axle of the earth mover shall not exceed 35,000 pounds. Such transporting of carryall scrapers is prohibited over Interstate Highways, and U.S. Highway 41 from Green Bay to Milwaukee.

Section Hy 30.04(5)(g) is repealed and Hy 30.04(3)(a) is renumbered as Hy 30.04(5)(g).

Section Hy 30.04(5) Introductory Paragraph is amended as follows:

Section Hy 30.04(5)(i) is created to read:

Self-propelled carry-all scrapers shall not be towed, transported or operated under their own power on the Interstate Highway System or on U.S. Highway 41 from Green Bay to Milwaukee.

Section Hy 30.06(5) Introductory Paragraph is amended as follows:

GENERAL CONDITIONS. General permits are issued subject to the general conditions set forth in Wisconsin Administrative Code subsections Hy 30.01(3)(e) 3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10,11,12,13,14,15,16,20 and 22, and the following:

Section Hy 30.08(5) Introductory Paragraph is amended as follows:

GENERAL CONDITIONS. Industrial interplant permits are issued subject to the general conditions set forth in Wisconsin Administrative Code subsection Hy 30.01(3)(e) 1,2,3,4,5,6,8,9,10,11,12,13,14,17 and 20, and the following:

Section Hy 30.10(5) Introductory Paragraph is amended as follows:

GENERAL CONDITIONS. Pole and pipe transportation permits are issued subject to the general conditions set forth in Wisconsin Administrative Code subsections Hy 30.01(3)(e) 1,2,3,4,5,7,9,10,11,12,18,19 and 20, and the following:

Section Hy 30.12(5) Introductory Paragraph is amended as follows:

GENERAL CONDITIONS. Vehicle transportation permits are issued subject to the general conditions set forth in Wisconsin Administrative Code subsections Hy 30.01(3)(e) 1,2,3,4,5,8,9,10,11,12,13,17 and 20, and the following:

Section Hy 30.14(5) Introductory Paragraph is amended as follows:

GENERAL CONDITIONS. Trailer train permits are issued subject to the general conditions set forth in Wisconsin Administrative Code subsections Hy 30.01 (3)(e) 1,3,4,5,8,9,10,11,12,14 and 16, and the following:

Section Hy 30.16(5) is repealed and recreated to read:

GENERAL CONDITIONS. Mobile home annual permits are issued subject to the general conditions set forth in Wisconsin Administrative Code subsections Hy 30.01 (3)(e) 1,2,3,4,8,9,10,11,12,13,14,17,20,22 and 23, and the following:

- (a) Mobile home annual permits shall be valid for the towing vehicle described on the application and permit and for a mobile home being towed thereby, but are not transferable to another towing vehicle.
- (b) Mobile home annual permits shall be valid only between sunrise and sunset. Mobile home annual permits shall not be valid on Saturdays, Sundays and during periods when adverse weather or road conditions such as fog, smoke, heavy rain, snow or ice or the velocity of the wind impair the safety of a movement under the permit, nor at any other times when there is not sufficient natural light to render clearly visible any person or vehicle upon a highway at a distance of 500 feet nor during the period beginning at 12 noon on the day preceding and continuing until sunrise on the day following every holiday as defined herein. "Holiday" means January 1, May 30, July 4, December 25, the first Monday in September and the fourth Thursday of November or the day appointed by the Governor as a day of public Thanksgiving each year.
- (c) Annual permits are not valid for operation on any part of the Milwaukee County Expressway System, constructed pursuant to section 59.965, Wisconsin Statutes, except on U.S. Highway 45 between West Florist Avenue and West Silver Spring Drive.
